Young Mr. Bryan was recently ordained for the ministry at Chicago, Ill., to go as a missionary to India in August, via Hawaii, Japan, Korea, China and Bombay. He is a graduate of the Chicago McCormick Theologi-

cal Seminary, and of Princeton, N. J., College. On a recent Sunday he preached in the First Presbyterian church of Richmond, Va., of which his great-grandfather, Rev. William S. Plumer, was once pastor. In June he attends his class reunion, before leaving for the Low Caste "Tangli" Mission field of the "Bombay Presidency," farther India.

Not long ago did this young man turn his serious attention to the ministry of the gospel and the Foreign Mission Field. After a prolonged spiritual struggle, the Holy Spirit so led his soul, that, like St. Paul, "he was not disobedient to the heavenly vision," and finally decided to become a minister of the gospel, and an "Ambassador for Christ," to heathen India.

It is these interesting personal circumstances that endears Rev. Alison R. Bryan to the Titusville church and people.

This city continues to progress towards greater things for its citizens. It has a grand Y. M. C. A. building, costing about \$100,000, well equipped to develop young men physically, mentally and spiritually.

Also quite recently a Y. W. C. A. building has been inaugurated here, costing about \$50,000, that will be a power for good among the young women of this city and its environments.

When metropolitan people desire to partake the joys, health and comforts of a pleasant valley, little city of ten thousand intelligent population, they cannot find a better home than now afforded by Titusville, with its fine residential and business streets, with all modern conveniences and enjoyments.
