The City of Portland asks written tenders of first growth standing timber suitable for cordwood and of jobs for clearing and tilling land.

In writing give full information as to ownership of land, legal description, number of acres, distance from railroad, carfare from Portland to nearest station, water and buildings available for camp, rough or level country, and kind of roads to railroad.

In addition to the above:

(1.) In offering timber, state its kind and quality, estimated number of cords, whether teams are available for hauling, freight rate on cordwood to Portland, price asked of payment to Portland, price asked of payment expected.

(2.) In offering jobs for clearing, state size of trees and stumps, condition as to undergrowth and vine maple, in what condition land is to be left, stump pullers and tools available for crews, price offered and terms of payments:

The Misca Smith and Miss Agnes Brown of Happy Hoidow visited Trenholm this week.


Mrs. McKnabe has charge of the postoffice and store during Mrs. Hein's absence, caused by her son's illness in Portland.
