

PROCEEDINGS MARCH TERM COUNTY COURT

NUMEROUS IMPORTANT MATTERS DISPOSED OF—MANY CLAIMS ALLOWED.

Court Will Reconvene for Transaction of Further Business on March 20.

On this 3rd day of March, 1915, comes on for hearing the petition of O. J. Thomas and 43 others, freeholders, residing in the road district or districts of said proposed road, praying for the establishment of a county road, described as follows:

Commencing at a stake marked A, at the intersection of Columbia Road and Roderick Ave., as platted on Beaver Homes Plat.

Following Roderick Avenue to Orchard View Road; following Orchard View Road in a general N. E. direction, on the best available ground, to about 100 feet, of the center of section 10, T. 6, N. R. 2, W.; thence east to 1/2 mile stake on N. and S. line between Secs. 10 and 11, T. 6, N. R. 2, W.; the place of termination.

And it satisfactorily appearing to the Court from proof filed herein, that due notice of the pendency of this proceeding has been given, as by law required, that twelve of said petitioners are legal freeholders of this county, residing in the road district or districts of the proposed road, and that a good and sufficient bond has been given and filed herein.

It is therefore ordered by the Court that the board of county road viewers meet at Goble, Oregon, on the 15th day of March, 1915, or on their failure to meet on said day, then within five days thereafter, and proceed to view, survey and locate said proposed road.

On this day the report of the board of county road viewers on the H. A. Ludy road was read in open court the first time.

On this 3rd day of March, 1915, there is presented to the Court that certain deed of conveyance from J. W. Curteman and Anne Curteman, forever dedicating, for road purposes, a certain strip of land in section 8, T. 7, N. R. 3, W.; and from D. C. Kirby, and Frances Kirby, dedicating a strip of land in section 17, T. 7, N. R. 3, W.

And the Court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the Court that said deeds be, and they are hereby approved, and that the clerk be and he is hereby instructed to file the same for record.

On this day the clerk presents to the Court his report of bounties paid during the month of February, 1915, as authorized by Secs. 5747-5761, Lords Oregon Laws, and Chapter 191 General Laws of Oregon, showing warrant No. 9593 in the sum of \$6.00, issued February 1, 1915, in favor of G. W. Parker; warrant No. 9594 in the sum of \$14.00, issued February 4, in favor of Fred W. Ploeter; warrant No. 9711 in the sum of \$26.00, issued February 10, in favor of Alsworth Wallace; warrant No. 9715, issued February 20, in the sum of \$9.00, in favor of Olof Soderstrom, and warrant No. 9716, issued February 24, in the sum of \$4.00, in favor of Joe E. Beavers. Total \$59.00.

And the Court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the Court that said report be, and the same is hereby approved.

On this day comes on for hearing the petition of Henry N. Walter and 18 others, residents of Goble Precinct, praying for permission to construct a sidewalk along the County Road for a distance of about 4000 feet, from a point about 667 feet S. of the section corner common to sections 11, 12, 13, and 14, T. 6, N. R. 2, W.; to the N. E. corner of block 9, in the Town of Goble.

And the Court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the Court that said petition be, and the same is hereby approved, and that the clerk be and he is hereby instructed to issue a General Fund Warrant in the sum of \$25.00 in favor of Nellie Stead, and a like warrant on the first day of each month hereafter, until the further order of this Court.

On this day it is ordered by the Court that certain order heretofore entered herein, whereby widow's pension in the sum of \$17.50 was allowed in favor of Anna C. French, be, and the same is hereby revoked.

On this 3rd day of March, 1915, it is ordered by the Court that the territory described as follows, viz: Beginning on the W. boundary line of Columbia County, at the N. W. corner of section 19, T. 7, N. R. 5, W., thence east 4 miles; thence S. 2 miles; thence E. 3 miles; thence S. 2 miles; thence W. 8 miles; thence S. 1 mile; thence W. 4 miles to the S. W. corner of section 7, T. 5, N. R. 5, W.; thence N. on the W. boundary line of Columbia County, to the place of beginning, be, and the same is hereby set apart and designated as Justice of the Peace and Constable District No. 5.

It is further ordered by the Court that A. R. Mellis and E. T. Wallace, be, and they are hereby appointed Justice of the Peace and Constable, respectively, of said District No. 5.

Thursday, March 4, 1915, 2nd Judicial Day.

Matter of petition of H. A. Ludy, et al., for a county road:

On this day this matter coming on to be heard upon the second reading of the report of the Board of County Road Viewers, which said report was publicly read on two different days of this term of Court, and no remonstrance or petition for damages being filed, and the Court being satisfied that such road will be of public utility, the report of the Board of County Road Viewers being favorable thereto, it is ordered by the Court that said report be adopted and that said report, survey, profile and plat be recorded in suitable books kept for that purpose, and from thenceforth said road shall be a public highway.

It is further ordered by the Court that the road supervisor in whose district said road is located, shall open the same for public travel.

On this day Alexander Ask presents to the Court his claim in the sum of \$50.00 as damages for one-third acre of land appropriated in the establishment of the Frank L. Smith Road, and the Court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the Court that said claim be, and the same is hereby allowed in the sum of \$25.00.

It is further ordered by the Court that the clerk be, and he is hereby authorized and instructed to issue a General Fund Warrant in said sum of \$25.00, in favor of said Alexander Ask.

On this day Thomas Pettijohn presents to the Court his claim for damages in the sum of \$50.00 on account improvement of L. Boeck road. And the Court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the Court that said claim be, and the same is hereby allowed.

It is further ordered by the Court that the clerk be, and he is hereby instructed to issue a general fund warrant in the sum of \$50.00 in favor of said Thomas Pettijohn.

In the matter of widening and straightening of the main County Road leading from the west boundary line of Columbia county to a stake marked "L" 414 20.5 P. C., said stake being 1385 feet south and 1418 feet east of the section corner common to sections 16, 17, 20 and 21, in township 5, north of range 1, West of the Willamette Meridian, in Columbia County, State of Oregon.

The motion of H. I. Kenney, accompanied and supported by his affidavit and the affidavit of Lucille P. Kenney, to set aside such part of the judgment, orders and entries of September 3, 1914, and October 7, 1914, by the above entitled Court in the above entitled cause, as respects the premises described in the said affidavits and the damages in such orders and judgements described, coming on to be heard by the Court, and after consideration thereof, it is now ordered that said motion be, and the same is hereby denied.

On this day Sunset Light & Power Company presents to the Court their written petition for permission to construct an electric lighting pole line on the County Road from Prescott to Goble, intersecting the Columbia Highway near Neer City.

And the Court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the Court that the said petition be, and the same is hereby approved, and that call for sealed bids for performing such work be published in the St. Helens Mist, the Rainier Review and the Clatskanie Chief for two consecutive issues, beginning March 5, 1915, and that such bids be opened on the 20th day of March, 1915, at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m.

On this day the County Roadmaster presents to the court plans and specifications for certain road improvement in road district No. 1, to-wit: Frank L. Smith Road and E. M. Watts Road, and the Court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the Court that said plans and specifications be, and the same are hereby approved, and that call for sealed bids for performing such work be published in two successive issues of the St. Helens Mist and the Rainier Review, and that such bids be opened at 10 o'clock a. m. on the 20th day of March, 1915.

Friday March 5, 1915, 3rd Judicial Day.
