

PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNTY COURT.

(Continued from page 2.) St. Helens County Road, as appears by the plat thereof on file in the office of the County Roadmaster;

And it further appearing to the Court that the owners of the real property through which said changed portion of said road is located, to-wit: Columbia County Real Estate Company, Amelia and Elmer Blackburn and H. E. and Adeline LaBare, having presented herein their respective good and sufficient deeds, conveying to Columbia County, for road purposes, all portions of said changed road not included within the limits of said road as traveled before such changes were made;

It is therefore ordered by the Court that said deeds be, and the same are hereby approved, subject to the report of the Board of County Road Viewers upon said changed road.

It is further ordered by the Court that the Board of County Road Viewers meet at St. Helens, Oregon, on the 25th day of September, 1915, or on their failure to meet on said day, then within five days thereafter, and proceed to view, survey and locate said changed portion of said road.

Matter of Establishment of Road District Boundaries:

Road District No. 3. Beginning at a point where the township line between township 6 N. and township 7 N. intersects the bank of the Columbia River; thence W. to the SW corner of Section 33, T. 6 N., R. 2 W.; thence S. 1 mile; thence W. 1 mile; thence S. 1 mile; thence W. 2 miles; thence S. 1 mile; thence W. 4 miles; thence S. 2 miles; thence E. 2 miles; thence S. 2 miles; thence E. to the bank of the Columbia River; thence Northerly, following the bank of the Columbia River, to the place of beginning, saving and excepting from the territory above described, all that portion thereof included within the corporate limits of the City of Goble.

Road District No. 4. thereof included within the corporate limits of the Town of Vernonia.

Road District No. 8. All the territory included within the corporate limits of the City of St. Helens.

Road District No. 9. All the territory included within the corporate limits of the City of Goble.

Road District No. 10. All the territory included within the corporate limits of the City of Rainier.

Road District No. 11. All the territory included within the corporate limits of the City of Clatskanie.

Road District No. 12. All the territory included within the corporate limits of the Town of Vernonia.

Whereupon, Court adjourned until Wednesday, October 6, 1915.

CROP CONDITIONS.

Following is a summary of the crop conditions in Oregon for the week ending September 7, 1915, as reported to the office of the Weather Bureau by special correspondents throughout the state and compiled by Theodore P. Drake, acting district forecaster:

Dry, warm weather continues throughout the week, being excellent for harvesting operations, which are nearly completed. Threshing is well under way in most localities, and reports indicate very satisfactory yields. Fall plowing is being hindered by droughty conditions, but summer fallow and fall seeding has begun in eastern counties.

The warm weather has been favorable for the maturing of fruit and other crops, and there will be a plentiful yield generally.

Harvesting hops is in progress in the Willamette valley.

Ranges, pastures and growing crops need rain. All streams are unusually low and many are becoming dry.

There is an abundance of seasonable fruit in the markets. Prunes are now being picked, the yield is fair, the quality reported as excellent and driers are busy.
