ORDINANCE NO. 200.

An Ordinance providing for the licensing of the sale of fresh cured meats by peddlers, within the City of St. Helens, Oregon. THE CITY OF ST. HELENS DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. Every person, firm, corporation, their agents or servants who shall peddle or offer for sale fresh or cured meats within the City of St. Helens, except it be the products of their own farms, shall pay a license fee to the Recorder of the City, in the sum of One hundred dollars per Annum; provided, however that a license may be issued for a six months period for one-half said amount, or for one week the sum of \$10.00.

Section 2. Any person violating the terms of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined a sum not less than fifty dollars, more than One hundred dollars, be imprisoned in the City Jail not less than ten days nor more than twenty-five days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
