BIG POTATO CROP

J. D. Farrell, president of the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation Company, a member of the committee on national defense, Portland, says:

"The railroads are now moving what promises to be the biggest potato crop in the history of the country. This crop, which is estimated will total approximately 453,000,000 bushels or half again as much as last year, has been on the way since the middle of September. The movement of it will continue until about April first, next year. Reports received by the commission on car service indicate that even with intensive loading more than 75,000 cars will be needed to handle the potato crop."
