compensation for a fair price for performing.

Whereas, the Oregon Journal has admitted to the voters of the state measure providing for the repeal of the statute relating to the publication of the delinquent tax list, has conducted a campaign of misrepresentation in behalf of said measure, and vilified the newspaper publishers of the state and placed them in a false position before the people of the state.

Therefore, be it resolved by the Oregon Editorial Association that the newspapers of the state make plain to the readers the following facts:

First—The uniform practice of the states of the Union is to notify owners of delinquent property of such delinquency through publication of notice.

Second—That because of the failure of county assessors, past or present to correct assessment rolls so as to conform to the deed record entries are not in possession of the names and addresses of owners of delinquent property and a written notice is therefore impractical.

Third—That under the system of mailed notices the mortgagee of indebted property is not notified of delinquency.


Fourth—That the owner of delinquent property is not the unfortunate debtor, but the boom real estate operator or the careless person. The former should receive publicity for the protection of poor persons who are purchasing from him on installment contracts and have no other means of learning of tax delinquency. The latter needs the published notices to direct his attention to his delinquency.

Sixth—That the discontinuance of the published notices will result in more property becoming delinquent thereby reducing available revenue to the state and its political subdivisions, and receiving the opportunity for the operations of the delinquent tax shark.

Seventh—That by increasing the amount of unpaid taxes the general taxpayer is compelled to raise additional revenue. Therefore the repeal of the present publication law is for the protection of the general taxpayer.

Eighth—That if the end sought is to reduce the cost of permitting taxes to become delinquent then the subject should be approached in a national and scientific manner. A

measure should be framed providing for reduction in penalties or interest, but in such manner as will not endanger delinquency.

We, your committee appointed to suggest to the state Liberty Loan committee a method for raising funds for the purchase of space in the newspapers of the state, beg leave to report as follows:

Appreciating the past hearty co-operation extended the press of the state by the State Publicity Committee, we wish to pledge to the State Committee our earnest co-operation with our news and editorial columns and we trust that the committee will call upon us and give us the opportunity to serve to any reasonable extent.

We agree with the state committee that the desired results can not be achieved with news and editorials alone and we approve the proposal of the state committee to make liberal use of the advertising columns of the papers of the state.

We do not feel, however, that we should be called upon to solicit funds for advertising in our own columns. We do not wish to be placed in the position of soliciting funds for our own profit and thereby leaving our-

elves open to the accusation of profiting upon the patriotism of the people.

We remain of the opinion, however, that the use of advertising space is necessary and also that the newspapers have done their duty when they give full news and editorial support.

That a committee of five be appointed from this association to meet next week with the county managers of the Fourth Liberty loan; that at that time the amounts desired for advertising in each county be apportioned and that the method of raising such fund be devised at such time and that such funds, be expended as suggested by the state committee.

We suggest that the committee appointed from this association to act with the Liberty Loan committee be given power to act for all the members of this association.

This committee suggests that in cases where the funds for Liberty Loan advertising must be raised by private subscriptions, that the committee having this matter in charge prepare lists of those who have previously subscribed to similar loans, as well as lists of those who haven't so subscribed, but should, and that the state committee co-operate by

writing to the persons given in such lists.
