

COLUMBIA COUNTY BUDGET

NOTICE

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 234, General Laws of 1913, Notice is hereby given that the County Court of Columbia County, Oregon, will meet in the Circuit Court Room of the Court House in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, on Saturday, the 27th day of December, 1919, at the hour of 1 o'clock P. M., of said day, and at the said time and place opportunity will be given for a full and complete discussion of the estimates of the amount of money proposed to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year as published herewith, by any taxpayer subject to such tax levy when made, in favor of or against any of the proposed tax levies herein.

The County Court has prepared and submitted the following: An estimate of the amount required for each department of County Government, County office or County Offices, each County Improvement, the maintenance of each County building, structure or institution, the salary of each County officer or employee, including those whose salaries are fixed by law, for the improvement and maintenance of roads, highways and bridges, the construction, operation and maintenance of each public utility and the redemption of outstanding warrants; And estimates of the receipts of the County from other sources than by direct taxation on the real and personal property in the County during the period for which such tax is to be levied, and the amount of balance on hand in the funds of the County at the time the levy will be made.

It is further proposed to levy a ten mill road tax on all the taxable property in the County, which would bring approximately \$133,265.67, of which sum 30 per cent or \$39,979.70 would be retained in the General Road Fund for bridges, maintenance and repairs and other purposes required by law to be paid from the said fund.

The balance \$93,285.97 would be distributed among the several Road Districts as follows:

It is further proposed to include in the annual budget for the year 1920, a uniform levy on all the taxable property of Columbia County for the specific purpose of market road construction on the amount of two mills for the purpose of equalling the amount which may be apportioned to Columbia County by the State Highway Commission under Chapter 431 of the General Laws of Oregon for the year 1919, and for the purpose and to be used in the construction of Market Roads.


