

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

St. Helens, Oregon, July 12, 1920.

The city council met on the above date in the city hall, St. Helens, Oregon, in regular session. Present: Magnus Saxon, mayor; Robert Dixon, James O'Connor, N. O. Larabee, councilmen; E. E. Quick, city recorder; George Potter, city marshal; J. W. Day, city attorney.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved.

Reports: The marshal reported that the sidewalk in front of the Central Grocery store was in bad shape. This matter was discussed, and it was decided that the council proceed to repair all sidewalks, needing repairs, and charge the cost of such repairs to the property owner making it a lien on the property; as per motion made and carried.

Councilman Larabee reported that complaints had come to him about fires being built near the swimming hole at Milton creek bridge, and endangering buildings located there; the same was discussed but no action taken.

In the matter of notice to property owners of the assessment for improvement of Winter street from its intersection with Tualatin street, south to its intersection with Plymouth street: This matter coming on to be heard for objection and remonstrance to the assessments made for the improvement of said street, and there appearing no objections or remonstrances thereto, the council ordered by ordinance said assessment.

In the matter of the improvement of Cowlitz, Casenau, Oak and Tualatin streets.

This matter coming on to be heard on the publication of notice to property owners, of the completion of the contract for the improvement of the above named streets, and there appearing no objections or remonstrances thereto filed in writing, the matter was taken up and discussed by the council, and it was decided that the council meet on the 13th of July, at 3 o'clock, p. m., on the ground improved, and determine and assess the same, and report at the next meeting of the council.

In the matter of the improvement of Columbia street, from its intersection with the south line of Cowlitz street to its intersection with Tualatin street:

This matter coming on to be heard on the publication of notice to property owners, of the completion of the contract for the improvement of the above named street, and there appearing no objections or remonstrance made against the acceptance of said improvement, as made, the matter was taken up and discussed by the council, and it was also decided that the council examine the improvements and make assessment of the cost thereof at the same time that they meet on the 13th.

In the matter of the improvement of Wythe street as petitioned for: This matter coming on to be heard on the report, profile, plans and specifications filed by the city engineer, and estimate of cost thereof the same was discussed by the council and a motion was made and carried that the plans, specifications, etc., of the engineer be accepted, and that a resolution of the intention of the council to improve said street be made and published as required by the city charter.

In the matter of the improvement of Winter street from its intersection with Willamette street, north a distance of feet:

This matter coming on to be heard on the report, profile and specifications filed by the city engineer, and estimate of cost thereof, the same was discussed by the city council, and a motion was made and carried that the plans, specifications and profile of said improvement be accepted and that a resolution of the intention of the city council to improve said street be made and published as by city charter required.

An application for the repair of the interior of the building located on lot 21 and 22, Block 11, was received from Elizabeth Isbister, permit ordered issued.

Application was received to repair and add to building located on lot 14 Block 16 from T. B. Lott. Permit ordered issued.


