

WEED NOTICE

TO OWNERS AND OCCUPANTS OF LAND: If you find any Canada thistle, Russian thistle, Chinese thistle or quack grass growing on your premises, you are required to completely remove them, and if you find them growing on premises other than your own you may report such fact to the Road Supervisor of your district. Such weeds should be removed before any of them has shed its bloom or commenced to form seed. Chapter 247 of the General Laws of Oregon provides that if such weeds are not removed within ten days after notice they may be removed by the person appointed by the County Court at the expense of the person owning or occupying the premises and become a lien on the land. It is ordered that a special election for the entire county of Columbia be called to be held on Tuesday, November 2, 1920, in accordance with the general laws of Oregon, and that the judges and clerks appointed by the county court for the preceding general election shall act as judges and clerks of such special election. It is further ordered that the county officers affected hereby be ordered to take the necessary steps for the holding of said special election.

On this day it appearing to the court that the boundaries of road districts 4 and 5 heretofore established were not located to the best advantage in the matter of road construction; it is now ordered by the court that the boundaries of said road districts be, and the same are hereby changed as follows, to-wit: Road District No. 4—Beginning
