

**NOTICE OF ASSESSMENT**

Of a Portion of Cowlitz Street, Oak Street, Tualatin Street, and Casenau Street, in Accordance with the Following Notice to Owners of the Real Property:

To the owners of the real property subject to re-assessment for the improvement of that portion of Cowlitz street in St. Helens, Oregon, from the westerly line of Columbia street to the center of Oak street, all of Oak street from the center line of Cowlitz street to the center line of Tualatin street, all of Tualatin street from the center line of Casenau street to the center line of Winter street, and all of Casenau street from the center line of Cowlitz street to a point 330 feet south of the center line of Tualatin street, all in said City:

Within fifteen days from the 15th day of October, 1920, any objections, remonstrance or remonstrances, to said re-apportionment as hereto attached.

This matter will be heard and determined by the City Council of said City at the regular meeting of said Council on November 1st, 1920.

First publication of re-apportionment October 15th, 1920.

Whereas: The improvement of a portion of Cowlitz street from the westerly line of Columbia street, to the center of Oak street, all of Oak street from the center line of Cowlitz street, to the center line of Tualatin street, all of Tualatin street from the center line of Casenau street to the center line of Winter street, and all of Casenau street from the center line of Cowlitz street to a point 330 feet south of the center line of Tualatin street, by grading and paving the same, it having been completed and accepted by the Common Council, and the whole cost thereof as estimated as now ascertained, being the sum of \$241,844.

Now Therefore, We the Common Council of said City do hereby re-apportion said cost upon the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land abutting upon said improvement, and hereinafter particularly described, with the names of the owners thereof, and in accordance with the benefit directly or indirectly derived by each lot, part of lot or parcel of land so affected, in the amount set opposite and against each said lot, part of lot or parcel of land so hereinafter set forth, and we declare the same to be a proposed re-assessment upon said property to-wit:
