


**THE BUILDING OF A WAGON.**

A Georgia fruit grower says an orchard of 10,000 Kieffer pear trees in one block in that state has proven a complete failure. What else could be expected? To correct the matter every other tree is being taken out and

the open spaces filled with peach and pear scions of other varieties for pollination. It seems strange at this period that people will plant whole blocks with a single variety of the orchard fruits.

If 100 or more trees of one variety are set out it is in a block by themselves and adjoining another block is set with another variety. This will only give pollination where the blocks adjoin.

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
