**PURCHASING PRICES.**

**COOPERATIVE CREAMERY.**

We have now incorporated our creamery association. The name of the organization is "The Farmers' Cooperative Creamery Association." Now draw a long breath after reading the name.

We have ordered a 12-H. P. horizontal Leffel boiler, an 8-H. P. horizontal Clark engine, a 600 pound Simplex churn and butter worker combined; with the balance of our outfit in proportion. Our capital stock is \$2500.00, divided into 50 shares of \$50 each. None but farmers who are the owners of cows can become stockholders.

Our officers are seven trustees, four of said trustees to be the executive officers, as follows: President, W. J. Abbott; vice president, C. A. Hart-suck; secretary, O. D. Sullivan; treasurer, J. M. Cole. The other three trustees are F. D. Frost, B. W. Johns and E. Elliott. The estimated number of cows at the time of beginning is 335.

We intend to open the factory by March 20th. Our butter maker is James Fell, of Indianapolis, Ind., and is now on his way to Olympia. Our factory is under construction; located

near the business center.

That the cooperative creamery system works well in British Columbia is shown by the annual statement of the Delta Creamery Association, given below:

The Delta Creamery Company, Ltd., held their annual meeting in the Town hall last week, to receive the financial statement of the year. It was found that the association had had a very successful year, so much so, that the shareholders will receive a ten per cent. dividend, and after this has been paid the sum of \$250 will be added to the reserve fund making that amount \$2,206. During the year 1901, 84,127 pounds of butter had been made, amounting to \$23,389. The old board of directors, Messrs. H. N. Rich, H. D. Benson, Thos. E. Ladner, Wm. Pybus and J. A. Patterson were re-elected. C. F. Green was again appointed secretary. The board elect their own officers and H. N. Rich has been re-elected as president. A very pleasant part of the closing of the meeting was the presentation of \$75 to Mr. Rich for the able way in which he had directed the affairs of the association. The success of the past year it is believed was owing very much to his able management of affairs.

While Yakima farm lands command high prices, they are still cheap. There are not many of us here so old, that we will not live to see them selling readily at prices from 100 to 300 per cent. higher than those prevailing. Yakima lands yield from year to year \$20 to \$100 an acre net profit when planted to hay, potatoes, onions, hops, melons or any of half a dozen other crops. Orchards pay net profits of from \$100 to \$700 an acre. The crops and the profits never fail. Such land is worth more than it is now selling for, and we do not sympathize with the cry that prices are so high as to discourage immigration. Let the newcomer who thinks Yakima land costs too much pass on. The old settler is usually a pretty good citizen himself.—Republic.


