LAST ARGUMENT FOR FRANK

(CONTINUED FROM PAGE ONE)

here today with a hearing before the Georgia prison commission on the defendant's application for commutation of sentence to life imprisonment.

The chief new evidence presented was about the statement from Mrs. Frank, wife of the condemned man, in which she told of her husband's actions on the night of April 26, 1913, the date on which Ma. y Phagan was murdered.

A letter written by late Judge L. S. Roan, who presided at Frank's trial, in which he urged executive clemency for the prisoner, also was presented. The letter was dated December, 1914, and was addressed to Messrs. Luther Z. Fosser, Reuben R. Arnold, Frank's principal counsel at his trial, Judge Roan died in New York, March 23, 1914.

"After considering your communication asking that I recommend clemency in the punishment of Leo M. Frank, I wish to say that at the proper time, I shall ask the prison commission to recommend and the governor to commute Frank's sentence to life imprisonment.

"After many months of continued deliberation, I am still uncertain of Frank's guilt. This state of uncertainty is largely due to the character of the negro, Conley's testimony, by which the verdict was evidently reached."

During the course of this communication the judge said: "It is possible I showed undue deference to the opinion of the jury in this case when I allowed the verdict to stand."

Leading Judge Roan's letter was attended with unusual interest as its existence has not been publicly known until yesterday, and its contents not divulged until the hearing today.
