## PERMANENT STREET WORK BE REDUCED

Holes on Main Street Now Being Filled—Sewerage Nearly Finished.

Yesterday morning Street Overseer Gilmer put several teams doing repair work on North Main street, hauling dirt to fill up several rather bad holes that have been worn there. On account of the greater part of the city street forces being employed in replacing the old Belgian block drains with cement drains, preparatory to the street paving, the streets of the city have been somewhat neglected. However, the holes will now be filled and the rough places smoothed over. On account of the street paving work having begun, the number of city forces will be reduced immediately. Nearly all of the sewer work ordered by city council has been completed and no new work will be started in the near future.

### Russian Recuperative Power.

(Springfield Republican.)  
Once more the recuperative power of the Russian army is shown by its growing resistance, and for the present at least it seems premature to talk of the possibility of sending part of the German troops in the west. There is reason to credit the Russian claim that the retreat in Galicia was in great part compelled by a deficiency of ammunition; later claims that the shortage has now been made good are probably true in part, though it is not likely that the reserve on hand is very great, and another such tremendous and sustained attack on the Germans began May 1 might exhaust the supply again. But such prodigal expenditure not even the Germans can keep up indefinitely, and while the fighting is still heavy at several points, it is on more even terms. On the whole, the Russians got off easily, considering what a dangerous predicament they were in, and with the Russian line still intact the German victory thus far is by no means decisive.
