PROBABILITY OF BRYAN COMING TO ANDERSON

WILL DELIVER ADDRESS UNDER AUSPICES OF COLLEGE

ANNOUNCE NO DATE

Fred M. Burnett Went to Columbia to See Great Peace Advocate Regarding Matter.

Mr. Fred M. Burnett, secretary of Anderson college went to Columbia Thursday to confer with William Jennings Bryan about his coming to Anderson sometime during the winter to deliver an address.

Mr. Burnett stated that Mr. Bryan would be able to come to Anderson later in the season provided he was not sent abroad on the peace mission which is being contemplated.

Mr. Burnett stated that Mr. Bryan was not free to make engagements after November 1, because of this proposed peace mission abroad, and that all of his time up until then was occupied.

Mr. Burnett stated that Mr. Bryan showed much surprise when told of Anderson's size and the number of people here.

"There was a tremendous crowd out to hear the former secretary of state in Columbia," stated Mr. Burnett.

MORE PAVING BONDS CAN NOW BE ISSUED

OWING TO INCREASE IN TAX ASSESSMENTS IN THE CITY

CAN DO MORE WORK

Since More Money Will Be Available and City Will Be Able to Have More Paved Streets.

Mayor Godfrey stated yesterday that sufficient tax returns had been received from the state tax commission to insure this city's being able to issue \$12,000, certainly \$10,000 of the remaining \$20,000 street paving bonds ordered at the recent election.

Several months ago \$100,000 of street paving bonds were authorized and \$80,000 of these bonds were issued and sold, this amount almost taking up the bond limitation of the city.

This matter has been discussed at the meetings of the paving commission several times, but up until yesterday it was impossible to learn what the tax assessment on certain property in the city would be.

In this connection it might be stated that the city engineer has surveyed Manning street and finds that this street, from River to Whitner, can be paved with asphalt, and that McDuffie street, Benson to Whitner, can be paved with asphalt.

It will be recalled that the city engineer was directed to make a survey of Manning street and prepare costs of paving this street.
