## "WHAT IS SUCCESS?" BY DR. JOHN E. WHITE

PLEADS WITH YOUNG MEN  
TO LET GOD HAVE  
WAY

NEED HIS HELP

Did Not Promise Key to Wealth,  
Health, or Fame, But the  
Best Plan.

Dr. John E. White preached to a deeply interested congregation, which included a great many of the young men of Anderson at his evening service in the First Baptist church Sunday "The secret of Success" was the subject. He offered Jesus Christ as the supreme illustration of success, which he defined as "making the most of one's self." This, he asserted, no man could do. He declined to consider God's plan for his life and God's help in working out the plan. The text of the sermon was John 8:29, "I do nothing by myself, but speak as the Father has taught me. He who sent me is at my side; he has not left me alone; for I always do what pleases Him."

"I have always believed," Dr. White said, "that if men could be induced to lay aside their conceit long enough to examine, candidly and closely, their situation in this world it would not be hard to convince them that they do not get on at all without God's help, and that if they would let Him stay with them, their success in life would be assured. I wish to submit a proposition, especially to the young man who is not yet hopelessly tangled up with failure, and who really wants to achieve a big success with his life, that if he will hear what I am going to say tonight he will get the key that will unlock for him the secret of success whether he uses it or not."

**What Is Success?**  
I do not promise you the key to health, or to wealth, or to fame. All the sick men and poor men and obscure men are not failures. I think you will agree also that the athletes and millionaires and famous men are not all successes. What is success? The law of success you are to consider is something deeper and diviner than the chance distinctions which move men up and down before the public in the news papers. Success is scientifically the same for a flower and a man. God who made them their life, plans for both a success with their life. The flower is successful when from the seed it blossoms forth what God put in it, as possibility of beauty and fragrance. A man succeeds when out of the babe he was comes the manhood he ought to be. Briefly then, success in life is a developed life. He only is successful who has made something of himself by fulfilling the capacities of body, mind and spirit with which the Creator has endowed him. How is a man to do this? We now approach the secret.

**It Takes Two to Do It**  
I assume that you agree with the verdict of history that Jesus Christ, considered every way, is the supreme illustration of a successful career. Looking into the cradle of Bethlehem, we behold a babe just like any other baby in its mother's arms. That child is simply a bundle of potencies. The odds seem gramed up against it. That little boy so used his time, his talents, his opportunities, and the powers at his command, that He is known across a universe as the king of kings and lord of lords. Do not suppose I am saying that men of you following his example can achieve what He achieved. Jesus was not an average child, not an ordinary piece of human nature. But I am saying that His example is the supreme example of success in this world, and was given precisely for the ordinary as well as for the extraordinary man. He solved the problem of human life step by step as they arose in his path. They were such problems as every man meets daily. He knew how to succeed in every issue from the carpenter shop to the Cross of Calvary. What was His secret? It was simply this—he did nothing of himself. He always associated himself with Omnipotence. He identified himself with power. Wherever in the New Testament you meet Him, another is with Him. He team-worked with God. There was no conquering Him unless you conquered God. It took two to make this marvelous success of a man. This is the meaning of the Incarnation, and this is the secret of Jesus. The question then comes, "How did Jesus manage it?" He did manage it and did it intentionally and with resolution. He was no automaton of a man moved along involuntarily by a power either within or without Him. What this Bible says you can and ought to do in the exercise of your will Jesus did actually do in the exercise of His will. The consciousness of Christ was an intelligent consciousness. Here is how He managed it, the text clearly asserts. It, God never left Him alone because He did that which will keep God with any man. He fulfilled the condition of Divine companionship. "The Father has not left me alone," Jesus said, "because I always do what pleases Him."

**Going With God.**  
I have stated to you the secret of sure success. It is simply conceiving your life as a trust you have received from God, for which He has planned fulfillment, and looking to Him to help you make the most of it. What God's plan for your life is, you may only know that it is a good plan, one that will bring out of your life what has been put in it of capacity. The greatest idea that the human mind has been permitted to entertain is that there is a will of God for everybody and everything. The failures of men are failures primarily to know and do the will of God. This is true of the farmer, of the scientist, of the inventor, of the statesman. Scientific agriculture may be stated profoundly and truly in the terms of religion. It consists in discovering and obeying the laws of nature. What are the laws governing nature, but the will of Almighty God? Prof. Henry, the great chemist, was in the habit of saying to his class, when about to perform an experiment, "Young gentlemen, I am going to ask God a question in chemistry." John Kepler discovering the law governing the movements of planets, exclaimed "Great God, I am thinking Thy thoughts after Thee." The biographer of Cecil Rhodes says that the great man's career of success in South Africa dated from the hour he declared, "I am going to find out which way God is going in South Africa and go with Him." What do you suppose President Woodrow Wilson meant three weeks ago, on the day after the Lusitania was sunk by the Germans, when he came to the meeting of his cabinet to consider the tremendous issue confronting the nation? Taking his seat at the table, amidst a tense and solemn silence, he said to the cabinet members, "Gentlemen, I do not know whether you believe in prayer or not. I do. Let us pray and ask the help of God." And right there the president of the United States fell upon his knees and the members of the cabinet did the same and the president in simple quiet words of prayer, asked God not to leave them alone, and show them His will and His plans for the nation. Does not impress you that the will of God for your life is worth considering? Should it not make some impression upon your mind to be told that neglecting God's will, or fighting against it, is bound to result in the failure and misery of your life. You have been going for years supposing that you had only yourself to consider, your tastes, your impulses, your whims. Would you call that good judgment in the future trying to get results out of the soil, or in the scientist pursuing his investigation of nature? I am not making a plea tonight for church members. I am making an argument and an appeal to conscience and reason. I am pleading in the name of Jesus Christ for you to make some account of Him, and let Him be the Master of your life. I know He will teach you to walk with God. I know He will save you from your miserable low ideals of success. I know He will teach you the secret of success.

**What Does God Want of You?**  
If this message makes no impression upon some of you, I think I know why. It is because a mistaken conception of religion is lodged in your prejudices. You think that accepting the will of God and trying day by day to follow Christ will bring on hardships. You do not care to incur. Among Christians the idea sometimes prevails that while God's will may never be safely denied, it is a hard thing to surrender to. Let me persuade you that God's will for your life is the will of a father for his child. His will is the happiest thing you could have done for you. Your mother never in her life wanted her boy to be happy and successful as passionately as your Heavenly Father. Robt. Falconer went into the woods with his New Testament to

find out what Christianity was and what it ought to mean to a man. After a week of pondering he came out with four glorious propositions of Christianity:  
First—It is a man's one duty in this world to know and do the will of God.  
Second—God takes on Himself the care of the man.  
Third—The man therefore will not be afraid of anything.  
Fourth—And so he left free to love God with all his heart and his neighbor as himself.  
This is Christianity. It demands a surrender of conceit and pride of opinion. It requires a broken and a contrite heart. But it is a glorious thing—the one opportunity God has made to save men from failure and disaster in the world.
