GERMANY PLACES BAN ON PICTURE FAKERS

Berlin, Oct. 20.—(Associated Press Correspondence.)—In attempting to put a stop to the pernicious activities of a picture faker who has been hawking about retouched, enlarged and indistinct photographs of a group of 900 German prisoners of war in France, who were said to be confined in a camp where letter writing was forbidden, the authorities have had renewed evidence of the desperateness with which people cling to the hope that their soldier relative, reported as "missing" may still be alive.

The picture in question, which sold for four marks, was so indistinct that faces could not be correctly distinguished. The allegation that the men in the picture were not allowed to write has led thousands of women to imagine that all their missing relatives were located, to fancy they could make out resemblances, to revive hopes almost dead and believe that the long silence was explained by the letter prohibition and to invest their little savings in the photograph.

The German government, finding repeated evidence that the hopes of women are being buoyed up by fancied resemblances discovered in this picture got in touch with the French government through a neutral power, and sifted the matter to the bottom. The original photograph was taken, it has been established, at Issoudun. Every German imprisoned there, the French government has assured Germany, has been reported through the regular channels as a prisoner of war, and every one of them is allowed and encouraged to write home. Most of them have done so.

The German government has discovered that poor women, hearing about the picture but unable to buy it, have saved up their pennies together until they should bet the requisite four marks and try thus to trace their missing relatives who in all probability are dead. The picture swindler who has been trading on the hopes of women has not yet been rounded up. The government in the meantime has sent out a warning in the hope of checking the abuse.


