A YOSEMITE FLORA.

Paul Elder and Company, San Francisco, will publish in April an important work, entitled "A Yosemite Flora," by Harvey Monroe Hall, Pr. D., assistant professor of botany in the University of California, and Carlotta Case Hall, B. S. The work will give a descriptive account of the ferns and flowering plants, including the trees, of the Yosemite National Park, with simple keys for their identification; covering most of the species found from Tahoe on the north to King's river on the south. It is to be illustrated with eleven plates and one hundred and seventy figures in the text.
