Huff, of Whiting, were Christmas day visitors in the home of Mr. and Mrs. S. J. Oliver. Sioux City Journal, 6: Government secret service men last night arrested William Bartels, of Hubbard, Neb., and brought him to Sioux City on a charge of uttering remarks against the government and president. Bartels is being held in the county jail. So vehement has been Bartels' talk concerning the government that it has attracted the attention of people throughout the entire county, it is alleged. At Homer the sentiment became so strong that threats of lynching were being made against the man. It is alleged that Bartels refused to purchase Liberty bonds and that he also refused to donate anything to the Red Cross fund. Secret service men have been investigating him for some time. So persistent did the rumors become that a lynching party was to be held that they went into Dakota county last night and brought him to Sioux City. Although the men are working out of Sioux City at the present time they are under the Omaha office. Sioux City Journal, 3: The Morningside Red Cross auxiliary will meet this afternoon in two divisions. Mrs. J. A. Ott, 4504 Morningside avenue, and Mrs. Jacob Leamer, 3820 Orleans avenue, will be the hostesses. The workroom in the Morningside college gymnasium will be reopened next week. A special meeting of the South Sioux City, Neb., council will be held soon to hear the report of a committee appointed in December to work for better street car service between South Sioux City and Sioux City. The full committee was unable to attend the regular January council meeting and no report was submitted. No definite time for the hearing of the report was set. A chicken thief who evidently was familiar with the habits of his victim stole several fowls belonging to Harvey Phillips, city clerk of South Sioux City, Wednesday night. Mr. Phillips left home early to attend the council meeting. Just before his return Mrs. Phillips saw a flash light in the chicken house. She ran to get a shotgun and give battle to the burglar. By the time she found the weapon Mr. Phillips had returned. He made a search of the premises, but the thief had gone. She said she understood that she was to support herself as much as possible. When she arrived in Sioux City yesterday, she left the McGregors at a hotel and started out to look for work. She wandered about the streets all day and crossed the combination bridge late yesterday afternoon. When it became dark, she went to the home of W. H. James in South Sioux City and he turned her over to Chief of Police Crane. She was brought to the Sioux City police station and is being held for investigation.
