BRYAN WILL DELIVER ADDRESS TO TEACHERS

Omaha, Nebr., Oct. 9. W. J. Bryan will deliver the principal address before the State Teachers Association, which will be held in Omaha on November 6, 7 and 8. Mr. Bryan has made a study at first hand of education in many of the leading countries of the world. He will speak on Thursday evening, November 7, his address to be delivered in the Auditorium.

James W. Crabtree of River Falls, Wis., former superintendent of Public Instruction of Nebraska, will return to God's Country and deliver an address. His appearance again in the state insures a hearty reception from the teachers of the commonwealth.

Dr. Frank McMurry of New York, who has accepted a place on the program, is one of the most widely known educators in the United States. He will speak on the "Characteristics of Good Supervision", before the superintendents' and principals' section.

Other speakers are Eugene Davenport, dean and director of the College of Agriculture, University of Illinois; Charles H. Jud, Dean of the School of Education, University of Chicago; and the Honorable Philander P. Claxton, United States Commissioner of Education. Mr. Claxton is an orator of renown and his address will be worth a trip to the meeting.






