EQUAL SUFFRAGE IN ILLINOIS

Governor of Illinois Signs Equal Suffrage Bill This Morning

SPRINGFIELD, ILL., June 25.—Governor Edward Dunne this morning signed the equal suffrage bill, which by its provisions entitles one million, six hundred thousand women in the state of Illinois to vote. This more than doubles the women vote in the United States.

The County Commissioners reserve the right to reject any part of all bids.

Letting of said contract subject to sale of Bonds to State of Nebraska now pending.

A deposit of \$25 will be exacted for the safe return of the general plans and \$15.00 for the steam heating plans.
