Sunday Closing Come to Stay
Miss Helen Hood, president of Illinois W. C. T. U., sent a telegram to the Chicago Herald from the national W. C. T. U. convention (in session at Seattle on Chicago's first dry Sunday) asking for the result of Mayor Thompson's order. The editor, Mr. James Keeley, replied as follows:

"Only six saloons open in Chicago yesterday. The 7,146 others locked and barred, curtains raised, screens removed, interiors in plain view. Twenty thousand saloon employees had day with families. Forty-seven arrested for drunkenness Saturday and sixteen Sunday; usual number for same two days 243. No suicides; usual number two to three. Every downtown theatre packed. Movie theatres filled to capacity. Church attendance considerably increased. Cafes practically deserted. Reported saloons on outskirts of city did increasing business. Hotels and clubs not centers of law violation. Hotel owners said exceedingly small number of guests stored liquor in rooms. Private lockers in clubs suffered little invasion. No arrests ordered during the day for keeping open. Violators' names taken and evidence secured to be presented to mayor. Police captains all over city reported quietest day in years—almost no disorder. Sunday closing looks like big success. Large employers reported Monday that working forces displayed highly increased efficiency as compared with other Mondays. Chief of Police Healey predicts there will be little or no difficulty in enforcing law and that Sunday closing in Chicago has come to stay."


