## BULLOCK A CANDIDATE

Alliance Man Files for State Representative by Petition, on Non-partisan Ticket

Judge H. H. Bullock of Alliance, who is engaged in legal work in the city and who operates a collection agency, has announced himself as a candidate for state representative from the 73rd district. Inasmuch as the primaries are already passed, the judge will file by petition, and left Wednesday noon for Rushville to file with the county clerk of Sheridan county. Upon his return he will file at Alliance. W. R. Harper of Alliance is the Republican candidate for this office, and Lloyd C. Thomas of The Herald is the Democratic candidate. The entry of Judge Bullock will place three candidates in the field for the office. While the fact that the judge is a little bit late in getting into the race may handicap him somewhat, he has many friends and will make a strong campaign. He states that he has plenty of time to spare and will devote a large portion of it during the summer to a campaign over the district, which includes both Box Butte and Sheridan counties. He was county judge of Sheridan county many years ago and formerly police judge of Alliance. The judge gives as his reason for filing that many of the "old timers" have insisted on him doing so and the experience and prestige gained during his "fifty-one years residence in Nebraska" will fit him out to make a successful campaign and an effective legislator. The judge is a very able man in many ways, and while The Herald believes that he should have taken his chances with the rest of the candidates at the primaries, it believes that he will make a good, clean campaign. The judge states that he will run on a non-partisan ticket and that his platform will be announced later. He believes that he will secure many votes from both the Republican and Democratic parties.

### OBITUARY OF B. F. GILMAN

Burton F. Gilman, oldest son of Franklin and Calista J. Gilman, was born at Fayette, Wisconsin, April 24, 1855, and died at Rochester, Minnesota, May 17, 1916.

His parents were pioneers of Buffalo county, having settled on a tract of wild land in Gilman valley, now known as the Gilman farm, in 1855. Here midst the privations and hardships of pioneer life Burt grew to manhood and received a common school education.

He attended Galesville University several terms and then attended Toland Business College at La Crosse, Wisconsin, where he graduated in 1874. He taught school several terms with marked success and was of the few Buffalo county teachers to receive first grade certificates.

Later he took a course at the University of Wisconsin, and graduated there with the class of 1878. He graduated from the law department of the University of Wisconsin in 1883, and was then admitted to practice in all the courts of the state, including the United States federal district and circuit courts.

He was married to Ella S. Farmer in February 1887, and in March of the same year settled at Nonpareil, Nebr., to engage in the practice of law. Later he moved to Hemingford and then to Alliance, where he was engaged in the practice of his chosen profession to the time of his death.

He and his wife had born to them three children, one of whom died in infancy. Two of them, Schuyler and Marjory, survive him.

He also leaves surviving him one sister, Dr. Helen C. Roberts, of Great Falls, Montana, and two brothers, S. G. Gilman and C. W. Gilman, practicing attorneys of Mondovi, Wisconsin.

Western Nebraska, in the early days, bid fair to become a populous and prosperous part of the country. The broad prairies and fertile soil of Box Butte county attracted scores of settlers and in a few years nearly all of the land in the county had been taken and most of it occupied by actual settlers. Several consecutive years of almost total failure of crops discouraged most of them and many moved away to places where they could earn a livelihood for themselves and families. Burt and a few other sturdy pioneers, with confidence in the future, weathered those days of adversity and lived to see Alliance become the most prosperous city in western Nebraska. Those years did not add to their material wealth but what is far more valuable in life it created a lasting feeling of friendship and hospitality in the community that at this late day is almost unknown in communities that were prosperous from the start.

Burt had none of those personal characteristics that lead some men to make a display or seek public applause. He did right because it was right. It was not in him to do otherwise.

With his fund of knowledge, mental ability and keen sense of justice his environments in life developed in him a strong sturdy character that left its impress for good on all with whom he came in contact.
