The people of Oxford are ridding town of gamblers; Jack straw parties are the latest rage among society people.

There are over 200 flour mills in operation in the state. A temperance club has been organized at Clay Center.

Editorial difficulties at O'Neill are settled with hard gloves. A branch of the Irish National league has been organized at Columbus.

Enterprising citizens of South Omaha intend to begin to drill for coal at an early date. A state award of \$4,000 has been claimed by the coal hunters of Chadron and a shaft will be sunk.

Insurance sharpers are making life very unpleasant for farmers in some portions of the state. The postoffice at Cass, Hamilton county, has been discontinued. The mail will go to Ludlow.
