

**ORDINANCE NO. 294**  
An Ordinance appropriating funds to defray the expenses of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the fiscal year ending on the second Monday in August, 1921, and levying a tax for the payment of the general and incidental expenses of said city, for the support, maintenance, and repair of the Sewer System, Public Library, and City Park of said city, for the support and maintenance of the Fire Department, and Police Department of said city, and for paying the interest upon, and a part of the principal of the 1910 Water Extension Bonds, 1906 Water Extension Bonds, Electric Light Bonds, Sewer Bonds, Sewer Extension Bonds, City Hall and City Park Refunding Bonds, 1919 Funding Bonds, Drainage Bonds, 1919 Paving Intersection Bonds, 1919 Water Extension Bonds, 1920 Drainage Extension Bonds and 1920 Paving Intersection Bonds, of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Alliance, Nebraska:  
Section 1. That there is hereby appropriated out of the money to be raised by taxation or otherwise by the City of Alliance, Nebraska, during the fiscal year ending the second Monday in August, 1921, the sum of \$51,930, for the purpose of paying the general and incidental expenses of said city including the expense of maintenance of streets and alleys, officers' salaries, stationery and printing, and garbage disposal; for the support, maintenance, and repair of the sewer system, the public library and the city park, for the support and maintenance of the fire department and the police department, and for paying the interest upon and a part of the principal of the 1910 water extension bonds, the 1906 water extension bonds, the electric light bonds, the sewer bonds, the city hall and city park refunding bonds, the sewer extension bonds, the fund-

ing bonds, the drainage bonds, the 1919 paving intersection bonds, the 1919 water extension bonds, the 1920 Drainage extension bonds and 1920 paving intersection bonds, of said city, in funds as follows:

Section 2. That there is hereby levied a tax of 15 mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the city of Alliance, Nebraska, for the payment of the general and incidental expenses of said city.  
Section 3. That there is hereby levied a tax of 4 mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of supporting, maintaining and repairing the sewer system of said city.  
Section 4. That there is hereby levied a tax of 3 mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Ne-

braska, for the purpose of supporting, maintaining, and repairing the City Library of said city.  
Section 5. That there is hereby levied a tax of 2 mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of supporting, maintaining and repairing the City Park of said city.  
Section 6. That there is hereby levied a tax of 5 mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of supporting and maintaining the Police Department of said city.  
Section 7. That there is hereby levied a tax of 6 mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of supporting and maintaining the Fire Department of said city.  
Section 8. That there is hereby levied a tax of 2 mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest upon, and a part of the principal of the 1910 Water Extension Bonds of said city.  
Section 9. That there is hereby levied a tax of 1 mill on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest upon, and a part of the principal of the 1906 Water Extension Bonds of said city.  
Section 10. That there is hereby levied a tax of 5-10 mill on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest upon, and a part of the principal of the Electric Light Bonds of said city.  
Section 11. That there is hereby levied a tax of 2 mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest upon the Sewer Bonds of said city.  
Section 12. That there is hereby levied a tax of 5-10 mill upon each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest upon, and a part of the principal of the City Hall and City Park Refunding Bonds of said city.  
Section 13. That there is hereby levied a tax of 1 mill on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest upon, and a part of the principal of the City Hall and City Park Refunding Bonds of said city.  
Section 14. That there is hereby levied a tax of 3 mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest upon, and a part of the principal of the 1919 Funding Bonds of said city.  
Section 15. That there is hereby levied a tax of 3 mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest upon, and part of the principal of the Drainage Bonds of said city.  
Section 16. That there is hereby levied a tax of 2.5 mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest upon, and part of the principal of the 1919 Paving Intersection Bonds of said city.  
Section 17. That there is hereby levied a tax of 5-10 mill on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest upon 1919 Water Extension Bonds of said city.  
Section 18. That there is hereby levied a tax of 1 mill on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest upon the 1920 Drainage Extension Bonds of said city.  
Section 19. That there is hereby levied a tax of 2 mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest upon the 1920 Paving Intersection Bonds of said city.  
Section 20. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval, and publication, according to law.

**NOTICE**  
Notice to the owners of property within Paving District No. 6 of the City of Alliance, in Box Butte County, Nebraska, the said district including and embracing the following described property, to-wit: Lots 1 to 6 both inclusive, Block 8, Second Addition to the City of Alliance, Nebraska, Lot 29 County Addition to the City of Alliance, Nebraska, and Lots 7 to 11 both inclusive, Block 4, Second County Addition to the City of Alliance, Nebraska.  
You are hereby notified that said paving district No. 6 which includes and embraces the property above de-

scribed, has been created by passage, approval and publication of Ordinance No. 291 of the Ordinances of the City of Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, as provided by law.  
You are further notified that if the owners of the record title representing a majority of the abutting property owners in such district, shall file with the City Clerk within twenty days from the first publication of this notice, written objections to the paving of such district, said work shall not be done in such district under said ordinance No. 291 but said Ordinance No. 291 shall be repealed. If such objections be not filed against such district in the time and manner aforesaid, the mayor and council shall forthwith proceed to construct such paving.  
In advertising for bids for such paving, the mayor and council may provide for bids on different materials, and types of construction, and shall in addition provide for asking bids on any material or materials which may be suggested by petition of the owners of record title representing 25 per cent of the abutting property owners in such district. If such petition is filed with the City Clerk before advertisement for bids is ordered. On the opening of bids for paving in such paving district, the mayor and council shall postpone action thereon for a period of not less than ten days. During said period of postponement the owners of record title representing a majority of the abutting property owners in such district, may file with the City Clerk a petition for the use of a particular material for paving, in which event a bid on that material shall be accepted, and the work be done with that material. In case such owners fail to designate the material to be used in such paving in the manner, and within the time above provided, the mayor and council shall in any event at its option reject all bids and readvertise, if in its judgment the public interest requires.  
The streets and avenues abutting upon said property within such district, to be paved, unless objections are made in the manner and form above stated, are as follows: All that portion of Box Butte Avenue in said city, extending nine feet each way both east and west from the center of said street between the north line of Eighth Street and the south line of Ninth Street in said city.  
The date of the first publication of this notice is August 10, 1920.  
A meeting of the mayor and council of said city of Alliance will be held in the council chamber of said city on the 1st day of September, 1920 at 8 o'clock p. m. to consider such objections as may be made and filed as heretofore provided.

The white paper, or newsprint, shortage causes the secretary of agriculture to turn his eyes northward and make some predictions concerning Alaska. It is destined, he believes, to become a second Norway. Its immeasurable water power, vast deposits of coal, enormous forests of rapidly growing species of wood suitable for pulp and tidewater shipments will make it, the secretary forecasts, one of America's principal sources of paper. Alaska is a large reservoir of natural riches. The United States bought it for a song; a nation never make a better investment. In mineral wealth alone it has paid for itself over and over again. Its fisheries have paid for it many times. Alaska is no beggar territory; it is a great reserve of national wealth.—Record.
