LOG OF A BIRD LOVER

Occasionally people say there are no winter birds in Lincoln county. This is either because they do not know the birds we have here or because they do not go where the birds are. During the following months we are going to tell about the birds we have seen here during the winter months and it may be of interest to know what birds to look for. We shall consider December, January and February as the winter months. Once a week we will tell about a winter bird and try to describe it so anyone can identify it. Keep these bird notes and they may be of value. The winter birds may be classified in three classes: the permanent residents which live here the year around as the crow, the winter migrants which come from the north and only spend the winter here as the owl, and the stragglers which only happen here on occasions as the Bohemian waxwing. Some of the permanent residents are more interesting in winter than in summer as they often change plumage and habits when the nesting season is over. Some of the winter migrants are the most beautiful birds we have. Of these are the redpolls, snowy owls and crossbills. The series will begin with next week's issue. The meadowlark is more of a transient than a winter resident. It is found in some parts of the country during a large part of the winter but disappears during the coldest weather. Occasionally some few birds stay here all winter. This is also true of the robin, the blue jay and some of the hardier ducks. We urge our readers who are interested in bird life to send us notes on the birds of Lincoln county so that our records may be complete and we will be glad to publish those which are of interest.


