THE POTATO AS A MEDICINE.

Considered Especially Beneficial to Patients Suffering from Certain Forms of Diabetes.

The good results of administering potatoes in certain forms of diabetes are affirmed by a French physician, Dr. Mosse, who states that he has effected cures by this means, says Literary Digest. "M. Mosse thinks," says Revue Scientifique, "that this treatment probably acts by alkalization of the humors, in the same way as the treatment by the alkaline mineral waters of Vichy; besides this, potatoes contain oxydases, and bring to the tissues ferments favorable to those oxydations that are habitually retarded in diabetic patients. The quantity of potatoes that should be taken by the invalid varies from two and one-half to three times that of the bread eaten. But altered potatoes should not be employed; when jellyed, they contain sugar; in too warm a medium they begin to sprout and their germination also develops sugar, as well as so-lanin."

The writer remarks that in the spring, when potatoes are scarce and not very good, potato-bread may be used to advantage, although little known. This is prepared by mixing in proportions varying from one-quarter to one-third, wheat flour with mashed potatoes. This food tastes enough like ordinary bread to make it palatable to persons who feel that they must have plenty of the latter. The use of the potato instead of bread deprives the body of certain useful phosphates that are contained in the latter; but this objection may be removed, we are told, by adding eggs to the diet, especially the yolks.

AMERICAN BOY AT OXFORD.

He Needs a Lively Imagination to Reap the Full Benefit of the Old College.

Other influences than the merely intellectual will be sure to affect the student in his sojourn. He will walk daily through historic halls, peopled with shadowy forms continuously stimulant to his imagination. He will find cultivated nature in its most attractive guise. Most of the colleges have gardens; some of them, as those of Wadham, Worcester, New college and St. John's, exquisite in beauty. He can watch the swans on the water at Worcester, can dream under the window of Charles I. at St. John's, or can, with the "Spectator," stroll down the Addison's walk at Magdalen.

Yet beautiful and historic as are its gardens and its architecture, and much as they create the leisure and calm of scholarships, if his imagination be not dormant, he may live in a spiritual and not merely in a natural Oxford, writes Francis Hovey Stoddard, in Review of Reviews. Many centuries are about him, and many minds have there ripened to varied fruitage. In some sort he can help his age if he brings back something of corrective for its lack of balance, of patience, of serenity. In this ancient home of scholars he may, if he be wise, find the mental attitude and the moral quality which our time most lacks and most needs. He will have had an opportunity to compare two civilizations, foremost in the world's work to-day. He will have been a fortunate youth, and should return, if not a profounder scholar, at least a better citizen and a truer American.
