MANY things in Governor Tillman's message will meet with general approval.

The recommendation of the Governor that an act should be passed debarbing all lawyers who appeal to the Supreme Court on frivolous exceptions is an exceedingly weak point in his message.

The Christian Neighbor doesn't like the language of President Harrison's Thanksgiving Proclamation because the name of Jesus Christ is not mentioned, and for the same reason it objects to Governor Tillman's.

Edward G. Palmer, Sr., Esq., died at Valencia, his residence near Ridgeway, on 23rd inst., from influenza, after a short illness, at the age of sixty-eight years.

He was the oldest son of the late Hon. E. G. Palmer. He graduated high in the class of 1842 at the South Carolina College, and read law with Henry W. DeSaussure, Esq., of Charleston.

The great question before the people in 1853 was that of secession per se or co-operation, whether it was expedient then and there to take South Carolina out of the Union without reference to action of other Southern States.

In a campaign during that year involving this issue with pen and voice he worked night and day.

He assumed the editorial chair of the Fairfield Herald, and also canvassed the district in opposition to his father, W. J. Alston, afterwards Governor. The campaign resulted in favor of Mr. Palmer's views in Fairfield and his father was defeated for office in this district.

serious as to prevent his continued residence abroad until 1861, when his State finally (but too late for success) had assumed the policy he advocated so earnestly ten years sooner, and he returned to this country.

In getting through the lines, although furnished by President Lincoln himself with a passport, he was detained by Gen. Dix in Fortress Monroe, and placed there in confinement in a cell.

The exposure he suffered brought on at once a second attack of paralysis, when the Federal authorities permitted his exchange as one who could never bear arms in defence of his native State he loved so well.

At the close of his life his sufferings were slight, and his funeral occurred Wednesday at St. Stephen's Church at Ridgeway, Rev. Mr. Mitchell conducting the service. We extend our sympathy to his relations and friends who mourn his loss.

WHAT THE LEGISLATURE IS DOING. COLEMAN, S. C., Nov. 29.—Special: The Legislature met according to schedule on Tuesday, and has been at work since then except for Thanksgiving Day, which was kept in different ways.

The Legislature has not settled down to hard work yet. Some measures coming over from last session have been killed, as they should have been. Among these was a bill to make each county pay for its insane in the Asylum, and another was one that directed a commission of State officers to designate a newspaper in each county to receive all the public printing.

The house passes the bill to require persons about to marry to take out a license. There is much difference of opinion on the wisdom of the measure. Some think that this State should still retain the distinction of letting people get married easier and giving them lighter than any other civilized country.

Without discussing the question, it may be observed that this bill is an innovation, and will greatly change the old law and custom in regard to proof of marriage, and the idea of it. Advocates of a divorce hope that their turn will come next. I know of a lawyer that is said to have more than one case of divorce if the Legislature will only be so considerate as to pass the act.

It has been announced that the Legislature would elect a Chief Justice on Friday, and a good many people hurried to the State House, only to hear the monotonous reading of some charter of incorporation. It seems that the Senate was not ready to meet the House in this little amusement, and the aspirants must wait till Tuesday to end their suspense.

Compeller General Ellerbe was a little too rash in his strictures on Judge Hudson. Every one who has paid any attention to the course of justice in this State in the past decade recognizes the legal acumen of Hudson. He is a wise judge, and an incorruptible one.

The people of South Carolina are not in the habit of having their judges accused of wrong doing, and this remark of Mr. Ellerbe brings the ear of the public. Judge Hudson gives his decided reasons for his decision in this case and sweeps away the cobwebs of argument with which the Legislature's General surrounds his orders to the auditors.

There is a mania now for small towns. Mr. P. D. Miller is here with a large number of citizens to secure the formation of the new county of Calhoun from Orangeburg and a small part of Lexington. The proposed county will be 14 miles wide and 43 long, and will comprise to a great

extent, the old part of S. C. Malheur. If you will send anything, the county will be created. I will be interested that at the convention in Columbia, the suggestion was the most successful one. It seemed as if the people would have their own way, but in the last two days a counter-declaration was issued on the same and turned the tide, apparently.

There is much to be said on both sides of the argument. Our units of representation are more largely those of the first of the States, and it is claimed that every county has its own representation. On the other hand it is significantly urged that small counties are more numerous. This is true, too.

Whatever may be said of the past, whatever may be said of the future that was voted on, it is time to rule the masses, I think that era has passed. There is no more need of a centralization in our counties. The people are changing from old ideas and methods fast enough, for this reason I think small counties are not as much demanded now as they were in the past. Let us go slowly in this work of tripping up and tearing down.


