THE wheat crop of Kittitas county last year, was estimated at 1,000,000 bushels. When silver was on the same footing with gold, the farmers of this county would have received a round million dollars for their wheat. They are now selling on a gold basis, and get about one-third the value of their crop. This is the present difference between bimetallism and monometallism: it is the difference between a true American standard and the standard of England, adopted and enforced by the Cleveland administration.—*Capital.*

The expressed will of the People's party is that we stand squarely on our platform. Let our People's party Legislators make no concessions!

It is unnecessary!

It is dangerous!

It is unwise!

On last Sunday afternoon R. E. Dunlap, State Evangelist of the Christian Church, held forth for 2 hours in the M. E. Church of this place, on the A. P. A. Mr. Dunlap is State Vice-President of that institution. He told a great many things that most people had already either read, or heard from others.

He was very extravagant in a great many of his statements—in fact, about as much so as he was a few days before in a private conversation, when he stated that the average wages paid the the laboring man in the U. S. for the last thirty years was \$3. per day, (including both skilled and unskilled labor.)

In the same conversation, he said the laboringman of the U. S. was wholly responsible for his present condition—there was not one but could have had a home to-day, if he had not squandered his wages.

One of the statements made by the lecturer, was that owing to a letter written to Jeff Davis by the Pope, one hundred and forty thousand Catholics deserted from the Union Army. He had better have the war records destroyed before he makes any more statements of that kind.

He further stated, that ninety per cent. of all the fallen women, commenced their downward career at the Confessional.

We never interviewed that class of persons to find out what were their religious views, in fact, we always supposed they had none.

His whole address was an appeal to the prejudice of his hearers.

It was more becoming a political demagogue than a christian minister and is not calculated to add anything to the church he represents. A minister of the gospel should be very careful to adhere strictly to the truth, if he does not, his clerical garb will not protect

him. The spectacle of a minister employed to go over the State to do evangelistic work and, while so employed, and paid by his church, deliver such addresses, and that too, on Sunday.

It is generally supposed (but it requires a big stretch of the imagination when one sees the attitude of the different churches toward each other) that all churches are working for the same object—the conversion of sinners and winning of souls to Christ.

But after the addresses we have listened to by preachers of different denominations and, especially, the one last Sunday, where a dirty political organization seemed to have complete control over the speaker, we are led to conclude: it is no wonder the country is filling with infidels. There seems to be more churchanity than christianity.

The Orangemens Association has been used for years by England to stir up a bitter hatred in Ireland between the Protestant and Catholics that she may be the better enabled to control them in their divided condition and rob them.

That is the cause of Irelands condition to-day.

The A. P. A. is the Orangemens Association transplanted in America under a different name but by the same class of persons and for the same purpose that the Orangemens Association was placed in Ireland, viz. to create a bitter hatred between Protestants and Catholics, while the people are being robbed.

One of the principles on which this government is founded is the right to worship God according to the dictates of one's conscience.

This, the A. P. A. denies to all except Protestants.

If we claim the right to interpret the teachings of Christ according to our views we must accord the same privilege to others.

The A. P. A. does not accord that right.

The A. P. A. or American Protective Association, a name calculated to appeal to the patriotism of American citizens, is no friend of religion, or our American institutions. It is strange this bigoted old word organization should find a lodgement in this country.

Any intelligent citizen who gives countenance to this un American society will have cause to regret it.
