

ROYAL CROWN STEEL



An 8 foot wheel elevated 25 feet, with a cylinder 3 1-2 inches  
in diameter, will draw 432 gallons per hour, or 10,408 gal-  
lons every 24 hours. Price, \$45 and freight, which will be  
about \$12.

The vane is a single sheet of steel riveted to a bow-shaped  
bar of angle steel, the two ends hinging on the pivot casting.  
The construction of the wheel which is ALL STEEL, is  
such as to give the wheel a light, airy appearance, yet make  
it the strongest and most substantial. The arms, double  
bolted to the spider casting, are made from angle steel, being  
the strongest possible form for the weight of material employ-  
ed. The outer girths are made of channel steel bent on a  
circle, they are so shaped as to form a bearing the full width  
of the sail, thus strengthening the same and holding its curv-  
ed form securely. The six sections when bolted together and  
strongly braced in front, as shown, make a very rigid, strong  
and safe wheel. Weight, 300 pounds.
