New Whatcom and Fairhaven propose to vote on the question of consolidation under the name of Bellingham.

Six cars loaded with horses passed through The Dalles Monday bound for the conning establishment at Portland.

W. V. Morris, of Dayton, was named by Congressman Hyde as cadet at West Point. Horatio C. Belt, of Spokane, was appointed alternate.

The harvest of the 1,200 acres of peas in the vicinity of Waterville has kept a large force busy the past two weeks. The pea crop is very fine indeed.—Index.

The Northern Pacific railroad company have recently filed several new indemnity selection lists at the U. S. land office of this city in which they lay claim to lands in odd sections already patented. Is there no let up to the octopus?—Waterville index.

C. N. Scott has purchased the old Vancouver, Klickitat and Yakima railroad—which runs out ten miles from Vancouver—and was intended to cross the country to Yakima. He paid some \$40,000. This road is estimated to be worth \$100,000 and the proposed extension will tap a valuable timber belt.
