**Not Wanted at Raleigh.**

Raleigh, N. C., Nov. 11.—A special to the News and Observer from Newberne, N. C., says: C. H. Gilbert, R. H. Bunting and ex-Chief of Police Melton, three of the white republicans who were forced out of Wilmington to-day, arrived here via the Atlantic Coast line this afternoon. They were met at the depot by a committee of citizens and notified that their presence was not desired. They showed a willingness to leave and were accordingly escorted to the steamer Neuse, on which they sailed at 6 o'clock for Elizabeth City. Word has been sent to Elizabeth City and it is believed they will not be allowed to land there.

**Memorial to Waring.**

New York, Nov. 11.—It has been decided by the special committee appointed by the chamber of commerce to provide a fitting memorial of Colonel George E. Waring, that an endowment fund of \$100,000 shall be raised with which to establish in Columbia college the Waring chair of municipal affairs.

The amount will be raised by subscription, and during her lifetime the income from the fund will be paid to Mrs. Waring.

**Chesapeake Oyster Men.**

New Orleans, Nov. 11.—In a few days there will arrive in this city en route to Galveston a party of prominent Baltimore oyster men, who own large oyster plants on the Chesapeake bay, and who are coming South to investigate prospects at these two ports, with a view of locating some of their largest eastern oyster plants. They are laying in special hopes on the prospects at Galveston beach. The oyster at Chesapeake bay is fast becoming a thing of the past. Not only is the Chesapeake bivalve getting very scarce, but it is harder to raise than ever before. The Southern oyster, however, is just as abundant as ever, and has long since established its superiority in the great eastern markets over the Chesapeake article. One of the gentlemen who will be with the oyster party has already purchased property along the Louisiana-Texas coast, with a view of entering the packing business.
