

W. C. T. U. CONVENTION.
 Washington D. C., November 30.—The National Women's Christian Temperance union annual convention began its sessions here today and will continue until December 7, inclusive. The sessions are held at the opera house. The attendance is very large, embracing delegates from all the states and territories. The most noted women in the organization are here and will speak during the convention. The local union made full arrangements for the reception of delegates. President Lillian M. N. Stevens of the National W. C. T. U. will preside and with the executive committee will devote today to the work of the committee, which consists of presidents of different state divisions and of forty superintendents of the various departments. Mrs. Barney, of the organizers of the W. C. T. U. in Jerusalem will preach the annual sermon tomorrow. There will be a temperance rally of the Sunday schools in the afternoon. On the 2d of December, Mrs. Stevens, the national president, will deliver her annual address followed by memorial services. In the evening a welcome will be extended to the ministers and responsive speeches will be made by members of the convention. Mrs. Clara Parish who has recently returned from China will speak on December 4th; on the next day the special feature will be speeches by the board of organizers and addresses by Miss Leonora Lake of Missouri, who is one of the vice presidents of the Catholic Total Abstinence society of America; Mme. Cayya Barrakat of Syria and others of note. Clara Barton, Joseph Cook and Rev. Charles Sheldon will participate in the exercises. This is the largest convention the W. C. T. U. has ever held. It will protest very strongly against the army canteen.
