Citation.

THE STATE OF TEXAS:

To the sheriff or any constable of Jefferson county, greeting: You are hereby commanded to summon John T. Gaffey and William M. Thornton by making publication of this citation once in each week for four successive weeks previous to the return day here-

of, in some newspaper published in your county, if there be a newspaper published therein, but if not, then in any newspaper published in the 58 Judicial district; but if there be no newspaper published in said judicial district then in a newspaper published in the nearest district to the said 58 Judicial district, to appear at the next regular term of the District court of Jefferson county, to be holden at the court house thereof, in Beaumont, on the 3rd Monday in September, A. D. 1902, the same being the 15th day of Sept. A. D. 1902, then and there to answer a petition filed in said court on the 19th day of November, A. D. 1901, in a suit numbered on the docket of said court No. 3081, wherein J. P. Smith & Co. are plaintiffs and John T. Gaffey, et al, are defendants; said petition alleging that plaintiff drilled a certain well for oil at the instance of the defendants on a certain 200 acre tract of land in Jefferson county, Texas, the same conveyed by Matthew Cartwright and Almazoh Houston on November, 14, 1842, recorded in book E, page 31, record of deeds of Jefferson county, Texas, beginning at the N. W. corner of the Jas. Rowe H. R. survey, thence east on line between said Rowe and Bullock far enough that by running a line at right angles to the division line of said league to make 200 acres, said tract known as the Henry Lewis 200 acre tract and owned at the time the defendants made the contracts to drill the said well by the defendant C. L. Hanson and since the said contract was made between plaintiff and defendants, the defendant Almaden Oil Co. has acquired some sort of interest in said land, and at the time of making of said contract the defendant Wm. M. Thornton and John T. Gaffey were claiming some kind of interest in said land, the interests both of the Almaden Oil Co. and the said Thornton and Gaffey not being sufficiently known to plaintiffs to enable them to allege same. Said contract is dated 30th day of April, 1901 and a copy of same is attached to plaintiff's petition herein marked exhibit A. That said contract is signed by plaintiffs and by John T. Gaffey and Wm. M. Thornton, acting for themselves and the other defendants herein. That by said contract defendants became bound to pay plaintiff six dollars per foot for the first 1200 feet of said well, and seven dollars per foot for 200 feet further, if defendants desired that well go that much further; and that plaintiff did drill the said well 1200 feet and at the instance of said defendants 200 feet further at said rates per foot, whereby defendants became indebted to plaintiffs in the sum of \$8600. That during the progress of the drilling, plaintiffs were paid by defendants under the terms of the contract \$5300 leaving the balance now sued upon, of \$3300 which became due and payable on the 5th day of July 1901, and that defendants have failed and refused to pay the same. Plaintiffs have filed said contract and account in connection therewith under article 3294 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Texas, and claim an improvement lien on said 200 acres of land for above amount of \$3300, and ask judgment for said amount and for foreclosure of said lien.

Herein fail not, but have before said Court, at its aforesaid next regular term, this writ, with your return thereon, showing how you have executed same.

An Ordinance.

An Ordinance Regulating Theaters, Variety Shows, Opera Houses, Theatrical Exhibitions and Dramatic Representations:

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Beaumont:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any proprietor, lessee or manager of any theatre, variety show, opera house, theatrical exhibition or dramatic representation of whatever character in the city of Beaumont where female actors, performers or employees are employed or permitted to be in any way connected therewith or where females are permitted to be in any way connected therewith or where females are permitted to attend to sell, expose for sale, offer for sale, permit to be sold, give away or deliver liquor to any person any spirituous, vinous or malt liquors or intoxicating liquors of any kind whatsoever, within the room or place where such theater, exhibition or representation may be conducted, or in any room, or place used in connection with such room or place, or in any room, building, private box, or apartment of any kind inside the room where such exhibition or representations are given, or in any green room, side room or ante-chamber of the same.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any employe or person in any way connected with any theater, variety show, opera house theatrical exhibition or dramatic representation in the city of Beaumont to sell, barter, give away or deliver to any person any spirituous, vinous or malt liquors or intoxicating liquors of any kind within the room or place where such theater exhibition or representation may be conducted, or in any room or place connected therewith as provided in section one of this ordinance.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any proprietor, lessee or manager of any theatrical exhibition or dramatic representation in the city of Beaumont to permit any female actor, performer or employe employed or in any manner connected with such theater, variety show, opera house, exhibition or representation to mingle or associate with any of the audience or spectators of such theater, exhibition or representation within the room or place where such theater, exhibition or representation may be conducted, or in any room or place used in connection therewith, as provided in section one of this ordinance, for the purpose of selling, offering to sell, giving away to, or drinking with any of the audience or spectators any spirituous, vinous or malt liquors or intoxicating liquors of any kind whatsoever.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any female actor, performer or employe, employed or in any manner connected with any theater, variety show, opera house, theatrical exhibition or dramatic performance in the city of Beaumont to mingle or associate with any of the audience or spectators of such theater, variety show, opera house, exhibition or representation within the room or place where such theater, exhibition or representation may be conducted, or in any room or place used in connection therewith, as provided in section one of this ordinance, for the purpose of selling, offering to sell, giving away to, or drinking with, any of the audience or spectators, any spirituous, vinous or malt liquors of any kind whatsoever.

Section 5. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than two hundred dollars, and each day of such violation shall be deemed a separate offense and punished accordingly.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage and publication and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith be, and the same are hereby repealed.

We, your ordinance committee, recommend the passage of the above ordinance.
