VOTE "YES" ON THE SECOND AMENDMENT.

This Amendment Will Reduce Expenses and Assume Competent Men in Control.

EDITOR LEADER:

Dear Sir:—There is one very important amendment to the constitution which is submitted to the electors at this coming election, and which has not been discussed in the press of the state, and that is the manner of conducting the state educational institutions. This amendment provides for placing all these institutions under one board of control, and to drop those provisions contained in article fourteen of the constitution providing for local boards of trustees. All the troubles which have taken place in these institutions have been more or less on account of conflicts between the board of trustees and the board of regents, the one board being in favor of localizing the institutions; the other in favor of holding them to the design of the constitution, that is state institutions instead of local institutions. In the nature of the thing there will always be conflicts between these two boards. If there is one responsible board for all the institutions, they will all be conducted harmoniously in accordance with the design of the constitution and the tendency to develop a complete university out of each state school will be avoided and all the schools will be held to their original design and kept within their proper sphere under the constitution. It appears to me that this amendment will bring about harmony in the conduct of all our schools and tend to strengthen them instead of weakening them by continual strife and conflict between these two boards. The voters of the state should carefully inform themselves upon this subject, and in my judgment should vote "YES" upon this proposition.

I call your attention to this amendment for the reason that our citizens have not been informed upon its importance and it has in no manner been called to their attention, other than by the amendment itself being published. The amendment is as follows:

Proposed Amendment to the Constitution of the State of South Dakota.

"Amendment. That Section three (3) of Article fourteen (14) of the constitution be amended so as to read as follows:

"The State University, the Agricultural College, the Normal colleges, and all other educational institutions that may be sustained either wholly or in part by the state shall be under the control of a board of five members appointed by the governor and confirmed by the senate, under such rules and restrictions as the legislature shall provide. The legislature may increase the number to nine.

"That Article fourteen (14) of the constitution be amended by striking out Section four (4) of the same.

"Term of office. From the time of taking effect of this amendment the terms of office of all trustees theretofore appointed shall cease and determine."

"Shall the above amendment to the constitution be approved and ratified?"
