

Scholastic Population of Oklahoma.

The new school enumeration of the Territory, lately completed, shows the number of school children in Oklahoma to be 146,049, a gain of 18,128 for the year.

The receipts from rental of Territorial school land for the last six months were \$135,825, which will be divided among the various school districts, and which will amount to 93 cents per capita of school population. The population of each county and the share of school money is as follows:
