### SCHOOL HOUSE

Additional Room Provided by Altering the Plans.

By slight alteration in the plans for remodeling the Central School building an additional room is provided in the new addition now being constructed by Contractor W. C. Adams.

As originally planned the building was to have the assembly hall on the main or second floor. A slight change in the remodeling now under way has made this possible, besides giving an additional room on the third floor. The new assembly hall will seat 500 persons, is well lighted and ventilated and furnishes a roomy passage way in case of stampede or fire.

The remodeling plans given Mr. Adams called for a three room addition. The change gives four rooms, each 25x36 feet, with convenient cloak rooms attached. On the second floor a wash and toilet room for the teachers 9x8 feet has been provided.

Each of the new school rooms will seat 42 pupils. When completed the building will have thirteen rooms with the assembly hall. To make room for the hall and to give free passage way the entire length of the building the chimney and ventilators will be moved to one side at the left of the platform of the assembly hall. The alterations of the plans will cost \$650 additional, making the total cost \$6,150. New blackboards, durable and lasting, will replace the cheap affairs now in the building. The new boards have a wood pulp back and are covered with slating.

Toilet rooms for both sexes are to be placed in the basement. They will be provided with white porcelain furnishings and be of the latest and most approved patterns. Between these two rooms will be an air passage, ceiled with lead, connecting with the ventilators.

Rapid progress is being made with the work. It is all done under the supervision of the architect and in a workmanlike manner.

The indications are that every room in the building will be filled to its capacity when the fall term of school convenes on Monday, Sept. 17.

### DOUBLE TRACK

Between Portsmouth and Northern Hill Station.

The electric railroad between St. Johns and Portland will soon be all double tracked. Anticipating the demand that will soon be made upon it the company has ordered the road double tracked between St. Johns and Portsmouth. This one of the few remaining stretches of road that is not paralleled. In addition the Portsmouth station will be removed, in order that the right of way may be obtained. Work will soon begin on the improvements, in order that the work may be completed before the wet weather sets in.

### To Water Users.

Water used through hose for sprinkling yards or sidewalks or washing porches or windows must be paid for in advance, and used only between the hours of 5 and 8 a. m. and 5 and 9 p. m. ### TWO MORE GAMES

Added to the String of Victories For The Locals

Another double header was pulled off at the ball grounds on Sunday. But it soon became evident that they were outclassed at all stages of the game. By better all around playing the home team easily won out by a score of 14 to 6.

The North Portland Club was the victim for the afternoon performance. Like their neighbors, the Piedmont boys, the Northenders were more than easy for the locals. The former proved they knew very little about the game outside of throwing and catching a ball. They had a fairly good battery, but the rest of the team with the exception of short stop were non-players. Their first baseman seemed to want to field all the balls between first and second and was therefore never on the initial bag when he should have been. The local team played winning ball throughout, fielding and batting well. The score was 18 to 2 in the home club's favor.

### THE ROW

Between the Railroads at Maegley Junction Settled.

The differences between the Hill and Harriman roads in regard to the grades of the two roads at Maegley junction has at last been settled. The matter has been in the courts for the past six months. Last Friday the case was called and each road agreed to make concessions. The O. R. & N. will raise its grade while that of the Portland and Seattle will be lowered. This agreement will necessitate the changing of the grades on the right of way of each road for a considerable distance. Both roads can now proceed with the work of grading along their respective rights of way. No work has been done in the vicinity of Maegley junction for some months by either road. It is reported grading operations will be resumed at once and pushed to completion.
