**NO TIME LIMIT FOR VATICAN**  
Its Statesmen Seemingly Take Little Thought for the Inevitable Passing of the Years.

Time is not measured by the Vatican according to our accepted formula. While we think in days usually, in months not always, in years very seldom, and in generations nearly never, the Vatican thinks in centuries ordinarily, in generations fairly often, in years only under the pressure of unusual circumstances, in shorter periods never.

It is this difference in the measurement of time which makes the Vatican such a difficult subject for the secular political investigator. There is no time limit, in the usually accepted sense, for the Vatican's political thought. At least it is not limited by a lifetime.

The cardinal who at the time of writing is at the head of the Vatican's foreign office—secretary of state—is a very old man, who for 30 years has been connected with political affairs. He is believed to look ahead into the centuries.

He, I believe, is the only statesman in Europe who can and who does coolly discuss the possibility of Russian Bolshevism, under some form or another, enduring for 50 years yet.
