Commissioners Proceedings.

TUESDAY APRIL 3, 1900.

The board of County Commissioners met this day at 2 p. m. in the court house in the city of Canton S. D. in regular session. Present, Iver Nelson chairman, Fred Gerber, W. M. Cuppet and Auditor Minot.

Called to order by the chairman. Proceeded to open bids for the construction of the county bridges for ensuing season as follows.

On motion the contract was let to Arne L. Arneson for \$ 55 per foot. Frank Foster being present final settlement was made with him on construction of bridges the past season.

It appearing that Jno Johnson of Canton twp. was erroneously assessed on personal property for 1899 it was ordered that the auditor strike from the personal tax levied thereon against said Jno Johnson.

Instructions to Assessors was completed at the evening session. Adjourned at 9:30 p. m. to meet April 4.

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 4.

The board re-convened at 9 a. m. All present. Geo. Webb was allowed \$17.00 per week for 3 or 4 weeks for medical treatment for his wife at Madison, S. D. upon presentation of her condition by Dr. A. H. Rogers.

The liquor bond of C. Blanke of Tea with Jno. G. Hoffman and Wilhelm Hartman as sureties was accepted. The balance of the day was spent in auditing bills.

Adjourned at 9 p. m. to meet April 5.

THURSDAY, APRIL 5.

Board re-convened at 9 a. m. All present. W. E. Sherrard appeared before the board in relation to an appropriation for the new Orphans' Home building at Sioux Falls. After due consideration the following was unanimously adopted:

Whereas, the South Dakota Children's Home society is engaged in the work of caring for the pauper children of the state, and

Whereas, it is about to erect a permanent building where it can better care for them and

Whereas, various counties realizing the great saving the work of the society has been to the tax payers and have made appropriations to the society in sums varying from \$500 to \$2000, and

Whereas, the society has taken from this county 15 dependent children besides doing valuable work in causing other disreputable people who were likely at any time to become burdens on the county to leave the state.

Therefore, be it resolved that the sum of \$500 is hereby appropriated out of the general fund of the county payable upon the 1st day of December, 1900 to the society for the permanent care and maintenance of said 15 children. The county to be at no further expense in caring for said 15 children.

Board reconvened at 9 a. m. All present. The following resolutions in regard to the use of the court room were passed.

Resolved by the board of commissioners of Lincoln county S. D.

That the court room when not occupied for sessions of court, county institutes, teachers examination and political conventions of all parties, may be used for holding meetings in which the general public are interested.

That sectarian, secret societies, theatres, dancing parties, and meetings held for private gain shall be excluded from said room.

Parties wishing to occupy said room for any purpose shall notify the sheriff at least 24 hours in advance.

Whereas, Mrs. Cynthia E Coles a resident of this county is now of advanced years and in feeble health and is unable physically to care for herself without assistance and

Whereas the said Cynthia E Coles is the owner of a small residence property in Canton which she now occupies as her homestead but not having any means of subsistence outside said property, she desires to and for that purpose executed to Lincoln county a deed to said premises to reimburse the said county for any aid which it may render her for nursing and support, therefore be it

Resolved by the board of county commissioners that such deed be accepted by said county and the necessary aid furnished her and be it further

Resolved, That she be permitted to occupy said premises so long as it may be deemed for her best interests.
