THE ODD FELLOWS EXCURSION.

A Leader Reporter Was Among Those Who Enjoyed the Trip to Hot Springs.

Monday afternoon May 14 about 16 Odd Fellows and Rebekahs boarded the Milwaukee at Canton bound for Hot Springs to attend the annual conventions. Arrived at Sioux City about 4:45 where we had the pleasure of visiting with Leigh Milliman and Francis Coon, two Canton boys. Left Sioux City about 8:20 in the evening over the Northwestern with sixteen coaches full of jolly excursionists. When about an hour out of Sioux City it was found that one engine was insufficient to manage the load and we rolled into Norfolk in good shape. From Long Pine to Hot Springs the scenery was beautiful, especially at Buffalo Gap. We arrived at Hot Springs 5 hours late, tired and hungry but nevertheless happy. We were received by a large delegation of Odd Fellows and Rebekahs with a band. In the evening a grand reception was held on the veranda of the Evans, where we had the pleasure of meeting the Assembly Grand officers of which Canton was represented by Vice-President Jennie E. Nash.

Wednesday we visited the National Sanitarium for old soldiers. There are nine buildings radiating from a center, forming a perfect circle and the center may be used for an artificial lake. The buildings are of stone quarred near Battle Mountain and the sand is from the Cheyenne river. The roofing is corduroy tiling. The main ward will have 336 cots and under each cot is a heating jet. There is not to be a stair in any of the buildings as the corridors are built on the incline. It is truly a magnificent aggregation of buildings as Uncle Sam never does anything by halves for the old soldiers. Sam Odegaard and Michael Kearns old Canton boys are doing the plumbing.

Wednesday afternoon we visited the soldiers home, where we were greeted by the old soldiers all eager to learn of Col. Linn, their old commander. To much praise cannot be said about his orchard and work done during his term of office. Every year the orchard bears bountifully, last year it bore large quantity of plums and cherries, and one pear tree had a half bushel of pears last fall.

At the home we met Oliver Burshim, a former Canton boy who has charge of the power house. It's an ideal spot for a soldiers home and the veterans appreciate it.

Later in the afternoon we visited Battle Mountain 1500 feet above Main street, where we picked up several fine specimens of rock and cones. On returning we were glad to find the dining room doors open. It was a busy day a sight seeing for all. In the evening there was a dance for the visitors which all enjoyed.

Friday we visited Wind Cave, the pride of the West. It took four hours to make the round trip, known as the Pearly Gates route. It was a scenic wonder from start to finish. There were 85 in our party, and 7 got lost or were stolen by the mysterious nymphs of the region, and were not found for an hour and a half after we were landed.

We returned to the Gillispie, where the waiters were kind enough to wait supper for us.

We left Hot Springs at 9:10 Friday evening for Dear Old Canton, feeling delighted over the scenery of the Southern Hills and well paid for our trip.

The Northwestern railroad rendered royal service and the officials were kind and attention.

We arrived in Canton at 8:30 Saturday evening tired but nonetheless glad we made the trip.
