April 6th, 1908, Council met this date in regular monthly session with all members present. Called to order by Mayor Gemmill after which the minutes of March 2nd were read and approved. Charged with intoxication. Defendant plead not guilty and a trial was had in which he was found guilty and fined ten dollars and costs. In default of payment defendant was committed to jail for a period of fifteen days.

Charged with intoxication. Defendant plead guilty and was fined ten dollars and costs. On motion of Mayor Gemmill sentence was suspended for a period of 30 days, during which time he is subject the further order of the court.

Charged with intoxication. Defendant plead guilty and was fined ten dollars and costs. Fine and costs paid.

City of Canton vs. Julius Jager  
Charged with selling and giving away intoxicating liquors. Defendant plead guilty and was fined ten dollars and costs. Costs and fine paid.

City of Canton vs. Harry Siglar  
Charged with selling and giving away intoxicating liquors. Defendant plead guilty and was fined \$25 and costs. On motion of Mayor Gemmill fine was suspended during good conduct of defendant.

City of Canton vs. C. Vermillya  
Charged with allowing minors in pool hall. Defendant found guilty and was fined ten dollars and costs. Fine and costs paid.

City of Canton vs. Otto Holter  
Charged with selling and giving away liquors. Defendant plead guilty and was fined \$25 and costs. Fine and costs paid.

The monthly reports of Treasurer Hanson, Weighmaster Corson, Street Commissioner Nordseth and Auditor Glendinning were on motion approved.

The following resolution was introduced by Alderman Redfield and seconded by Alderman Ovre:

Whereas, the following petition: "To the Honorable Mayor and City Council of the City of Canton, S. D., Gentlemen: We, the undersigned citizens of the City of Canton, and legal freeholder voters therein, hereby petition your honorable body and request that the question of granting permits to sell intoxicating liquors at retail within the corporate limits of the City of Canton, S. D., be submitted to the legal voters of said City of Canton at the annual municipal election to be held on Tuesday, the 21st day of April, A. D. 1908, a vote upon such question being desired; signed: J. E. Gillen, Alex Beck, C. A. Otto, Gunder A. Tvedt, Simon Ulrikson, P. A. Van Houten, K. Brandsgaard, O. T. Sigurd, Geo. Luther, Claude Robinson, M. Nelson, Mike Olson, M. H. Herman, Lars Knudson, O. Thompson, J. A. Benz, John Parsley, Harry Berg, Matt Schoenauer, Ed. C. Warner, J. M. Lewis, O. P. Nims, W. L. Stevenson, A. L. Anderson, Hans A. Skie, W. H. Shaff, Henry Wallace, Jr., S. O. Sorenson, A. Amundson, A. Faltenkamp, Peder Pederson, Geo. Nordgaard, Peter Fossum," signed by thirty-three persons claiming to be freeholders of the City of Canton, S. D., stating that a vote is desired upon the question of granting permits to sell intoxicating liquors at retail within the corporate limits of said City of Canton, at the next annual municipal election of said City and said petition having been duly filed with the Auditor of said City more than thirty days before said election; therefore be it

Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Canton, S. D., that it appearing that at least 25 legal freeholder electors of the City of Canton signed the above petition, that the question of granting permits to sell intoxicating liquors at retail within the corporate limits of said City of Canton, S. D., shall be submitted to the legal voters thereof at the next annual municipal election to be held in said City on April 21, 1908, as provided by law.

Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Canton, S. D., that it appearing that at least 25 legal freeholder electors of the City of Canton signed the above petition, that the question of granting permits to sell intoxicating liquors at retail within the corporate limits of said City of Canton, S. D., shall be submitted to the legal voters thereof at the next annual municipal election to be held in said City on April 21, 1908, as provided by law.

The following resolution was introduced by Alderman Sandvig and seconded by Alderman Redfield:

Be it resolved, by the City Council of the City of Canton, S. D., that the annual municipal election for the election of officers of the City of Canton, S. D., for the ensuing term of two years shall be held on Tuesday, April 21st, 1908, from nine o'clock in the forenoon continuously until four o'clock in the afternoon of said day, at the various voting places in said city hereinafter designated, and that at said election there will be elected the following officers: A Mayor, one alderman from the first ward, one alderman from the second ward, one alderman from the third ward, one alderman from the fourth ward, a city treasurer, a police justice of the peace, a city justice of the peace.

Said election to be held in the following voting places of the four wards in said city, respectively, to-wit:

First Ward: In the basement of the Lincoln County Bank Building.  
Second Ward: In the sheriff's office in the court house.  
Third Ward: In the basement of the west side school house.  
Fourth Ward: In the room occu-

pled by the City Council in the fire house.

Passed by a majority vote of the City Council this 6th day of April, 1908.

An ordinance amending Ordinance No. 171, relating to water rents, was passed on its first reading.

It was moved by Alderman Repp that a two inch water pipe be laid beginning at the water main in the street running east and west south of said street to the east line of Grant street.

Motion carried.

The resignation in writing of Auditor Glendinning was read by the Mayor as follows:

Canton, S. D. March 21, 1908.

To the Honorable Mayor and City Council of Canton, S. D.

Gentlemen: On account of having to leave the city before the expiration of my term, I would respectfully ask that you accept my resignation as City Auditor to take effect as soon as possible.

The following acceptance was then read:

Dear Sir: Your resignation as City Auditor, bearing even date herewith, is received and with approval of city council will be accepted to take effect on Monday, April, 6th, at the close of Council session on that date.

Allow me to express my sincere appreciation of your work as City Auditor and my great regret that necessity compels you to sever relations with this administration.

It was moved by Alderman Redfield and seconded by Alderman Sandvig that the resignation of Auditor Glendinning be accepted, which motion was carried.

The following appointment by the Mayor was read:

Gentlemen of the City Council: I hereby appoint Henry F. Quien as City Auditor for the unexpired term of G. G. Glendinning, resigned, and submit the same for your approval.

W. C. Gemmill, Mayor.

It was moved by Alderman Redfield and seconded by Alderman Repp that the appointment of Mr. Quien be confirmed. Carried unanimously.

The bond of Mr. Quien, in the sum of \$2,000, with Otto Hervig, H. Anderson and G. S. Hanson as sureties, was

on motion approved.

Mayor Gemmill made the following statement: "Pursuant to a resolution passed at the last meeting I have employed Asa Forrest, Jr., as additional council in the Council case, with the understanding that he is to receive fifty dollars for all services that may be required to carry the case to a final termination."

It was moved by Alderman Repp and seconded by Redfield that the action of the Mayor be approved and that the City Attorney be instructed to draw up a necessary contract to that effect. Motion carried.

An ordinance amending Ordinance No. 205, relating to minors entering pool and billiard halls, was passed on its first reading.

The claim of Anna Nims for damages, which was referred to the committee was brought up. The same committee was continued and authorized to continue their negotiations with Mrs. Nims and report a plan of settlement.

On motion Council adjourned.


