NEW LAWS JULY 1st, 1909.

Several laws of importance which were enacted by the legislature at its session last winter went into effect on July 1.

The new anti-cigarette law prohibits the sale of cigarettes and makes it a misdemeanor for anyone to have in their possession the "makings." Dealers in general have been reducing their stocks as rapidly as possible, and on the night of June 30 stored or sold to dealers in other states such stocks as they had on hand when the new law went into effect.

Another new law is the anti-treating act. It provides that it shall be unlawful for any person in the state, in any place where intoxicating liquor is sold, to treat or give to another free drinks of any intoxicating liquor whatsoever, either directly or indirectly.

It also is made unlawful for any person to accept free drinks in any saloon, the persons accepting such drinks or "treats" being held equally guilty under the new law with the persons who offers the treat.

Any persons found guilty of violating the provisions of this law will be subject to a fine of not less than \$5 or more than \$10 for the first offense, and upon conviction of each succeeding offense shall be fined not less than \$10 or more than \$20.

Another of the new laws which went into effect on July 1 provides for the establishment at Custer, in the heart of the Black Hills, of a sanatorium and farm for the treatment of persons afflicted with tuberculosis, for the exclusive use of residents of South Dakota.

This institution will be for the education and instruction relative to the nature of tuberculosis and remedies for such affliction and for scientific research and study. Applications for admission to the sanatorium must be made to the board of county commissioners of the county in which the applicant resides.

### GAME AND FISH LAW.

A state game and fish law is another of the new laws which went into effect on July 1. The law creates the office of state game warden, and Governor Vessey has appointed as such officer W. F. Bancroft.

The new law, which is regarded as one of the best game laws in the United States, provides that the state game warden shall have general charge of:

First—The propagation and preservation of such varieties of game and fish as he shall deem to be of public value.  
Second—The collection and diffusion of such statistics and information as shall be germane to the purpose of the act.  
Third—The construction, control and management of all state fish hatcheries, including the control of grounds owned or leased for such purpose.  
Fourth—The receiving from the United States commissioner of fisheries or other persons, and the gathering, purchase and distribution to the waters of the state of all fish spawn or fry.

Fifth—The taking of fish from public waters of this state for the propagation and stocking of other waters therein.  
Sixth—The seizure and disposition of all game birds, game animals and fish taken, killed or transported or possessed contrary to law, of all dogs, guns, seines, nets, boats, lights or other instrumentalities unlawfully used or held with intent to use, in pursuing, taking, or attempting to take, conceal or disposing of the same.

The state game warden and all county game wardens have authority under the law to inspect from time to time hotels, restaurants, cold-storage plants and icehouses for the purpose of determining whether game or fish are kept therein in violation of the law. Any game or fish found in possession of anyone in violation of the law may be seized and sold.

Any implements used or intended to be used in the taking of fish or game unlawfully may be seized without notice by the game wardens. All fines collected for violations of the law will be turned into the county treasurer of the county in which the violation occurred and be made a part of the county fund.

OUTSIDERS MUST HAVE LICENSES. The law prohibits any person from

hunting with or shooting from a boat, canoe or contrivance of any character on any of the waters of the state between dark and daylight.

During the open season for the shooting of prairie chickens and other birds, every person not a resident of the state is prohibited from killing any of the game birds until he has first procured a license from the game warden or county treasurer. Non-residents will be required to pay \$25 for the right to hunt any game animals, and \$15 for the privilege of shooting game birds. For the privilege of taking fish of any kind from the waters of South Dakota, non-residents will be required to pay a license of \$2.
