

Extraordinary Forced March. HE BEGAN AS CATTLE THIEF

Shocking List of Homicides, Robberies and Tortures Perpetrated by Carranza's General—Frequent Massacres of Prisoners and Citizens.

Murder, plunder and outrage have marked the career of Gen. Francisco Villa, commander of the northern Mexican constitutionalist armies in northern Mexico. His record is one of almost continuous crime and is worth studying in view of the fact that the constitutionalist cause triumphs he will at least be second in power to Carranza.

IS NOT SATISFIED WITH THE TWO PROVISIONS IN CLAYTON ANTI-TRUST BILL.

PRESIDENT HINTS AT VETO

He Has Refused to Permit Actual Examination of Labor Unions From Application of the Sherman Law.

Washington.—In the omnibus anti-trust bill prepared by Representative Clayton and his fellow members of the Judiciary committee there are two provisions the progress of which employed and representatives of the labor unions of the country will watch anxiously and for different reasons.

An attempt probably will be made to amend the measure so as to make them more pleasing to the labor representatives. If these attempts succeed and the bills are made as drastic as labor would like to have them, and if the senate fails to eliminate the provisions, it seems to be generally believed that President Wilson will interpose his veto.

The two provisions do not go nearly as far as labor would like to have them go. For years the labor leaders have been preparing for a specific provision exempting labor unions and possibly farmer organizations from prosecution under the anti-trust law.

As has been said, these Clayton anti-injunction and contempt bills are a part of the general anti-trust legislation constructed by the government.
