DEATH OF Mrs. A. G. SORLIE
Another highly respected pioneer woman went to her reward on high, when Mrs. A. G. Sorlie died on Jan. 17th. She was born March 13th, 1836 in Gal, Hallingdal, Norway. She was confirmed by Rev. Kjelstrup in 1850.

Mr. A. G. Sorlie, and in 1866 with him emigrated to this country. The three first years after their arrival here they lived in Allamakee county, Iowa, and in 1869 they came to Lincoln, where they took their home. They were the parents of six children of which 4 are living. She has lived in this community for almost 46 years, so she and her husband had gone through all the incidents and struggles of early pioneer life.
