The death of Mrs. Thompson takes from among us, one of the grandest of our pioneers. She was a christian woman loved and esteemed by all who knew her and her going is a great loss to her family and a host of friends in Lincoln county.

Notice of The Submission of a Proposed Ordinance to a Vote of The Electors of The City of Canton

Notice is hereby given: That there has been filed in my office a petition signed by five per centum of the legal voters of the city of Canton, petitioning that the following ordinance be presented to the Board of Commissioners of the city of Canton:

Be it Ordained, by the Board of Commissioners of the city of Canton, Lincoln County, South Dakota,  
Section 1. That all ordinances of the city of Canton, authorizing the conduct of, maintenance of, operation of, and providing for the payment of any license for the conduct of, maintenance of, or operation of pool and billiard halls within the city limits of the city of Canton be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 2. That it shall from and after the passage of this ordinance, be unlawful to operate, maintain or conduct within the incorporated limits of the city of Canton, South Dakota, any public pool or billiard hall, or pool or billiard table or tables or any place where pool or billiard tables are kept for the use of the public and for the use of which any fee or price is charged, directly or indirectly, provided this ordinance shall not be deemed to affect licenses now granted before their expiration.

Section 3. Any person convicted of the violation of Section 2 of this ordinance, shall upon such conviction, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of \$100 or imprisonment in the city jail for 30 days or by both such punishment, and each day that any public pool or billiard hall or pool or billiard table or any place where pool or billiard tables are kept for the use of the public as specified in said Section 2, is operated, maintained or conducted within the incorporated limits of said city, shall be deemed and held to be and is a separate offense and violation of said Section 2.

The above proposed ordinance has been by me submitted to the said Board of Commissioners and which ordinance was not adopted by it, and

Further Notice is Therefore Given: That the said ordinance will be referred to a vote of the electors of the city of Canton, South Dakota, on the 8th day of April, 1915. That the polls of said election shall be open from eight o'clock in the forenoon until five o'clock in the afternoon of said day. That the polling places will be: In the first ward, in the southeast room of the Hotel Rudolph; in the second ward, in the sheriff's office in the court house; in the third ward, in the basement of the building known as the West Side School House; in the fourth ward, in the front room on the second floor of the city hall and fire house.

The question to be voted on is: "Shall the above proposed ordinance be enacted, confirmed and approved."


