New Rural and Star Route Mail Boxes.

The U. S. Post Office Department has designed two sizes of mail boxes for use on rural and star routes after July 1, 1916.

No. 1 is a small size, for letters and ordinary mail.

No. 2 is a large size, for all mail including parcel post. Patrons may use either size and will not be required to discard boxes in use July 1st while they remain serviceable, but all boxes erected after that date must be of the new type.

A list of manufacturers of approved boxes, with prices, will be published in the official postal guide and patrons should consult with their postmaster as to where they may purchase boxes of approved design.
