The Courier has an interesting account of a shooting affray by parties named Halligan, Tuttle and Beaver; some difficulty having occurred between the Beaver boys and Tuttle and Halligan. Tuttle went to the house of Beaver, calling for him; Beaver came to the door when Tuttle motioning as if to draw a revolver, Beaver fired at him hitting him in the shoulder. Beaver started for the mill, Tuttle starting after him and firing at him but not hitting him. On Tuesday Tuttle and Halligan came to Patens house and commenced firing around the house; Paten escaped and went to Elk Point for the Sheriff. Deputy Sheriff Lynch returned with Halligan, Tuttle having fled across the river.

Pete Bannigan, who was convicted of murder, last February, and sentenced to be hung April 26th, escaped from the jail at Bismarck, the night after the fire at that place; he was aided by friends named Driscoll, and Darrah, who was on guard, and who had only been in the employ of the Sheriff but a few days. Darrah had borne an excellent character previous to this and feels his disgrace keenly. Pursuit was made and Bannigan was tracked to 35 miles north of Bismarck, near Turtle Creek where his horse failed him, and took to the woods, but he was closely followed by a number of Indian scouts and soldiers from Ft. Stevenson. The Tribune, from which the above account is condensed, thinks "his escape unfortunate for Bismarck and more than one violent death may follow."
