COUNTY COLUMN.

Algonac has the railroad fever at present.

A fire company has been organized at Capac.

A Veteran's Union will be organized in Port Huron.

Employment is given to 135 men at the St. Clair ship yard.

Cobb & Comstock's stock was sold recently on a chattel mortgage.

Prof. Winters closed his dancing school at Marine City last week.

The widow of C. N. Fulton married her son-in-law, at Adair recently.

Port Huron is thought to be the headquarters of a counterfeiting gang.

1,000 pear trees will be set out next spring, by Dr. Folsom, of St. Clair.

Week before last, 3,500 pounds of butter was shipped by Fuller Bros., of Capac.

There are 92 scholars in attendance at the Port Huron Business College. This school is flourishing.

The position on the customs force made vacant by the death of James Gain has been filled by B. C. Redell.

Probate Judge Avery has sold his farm in Jeddo, for \$9,000 and will probably make Port Huron his residence again.

Policeman Cox, of Port Huron, has been suspended from duty for a month, to pay for being intoxicated on the streets.

Teachers examinations will be held at Marine City, Feb. 18; Brockway Centre, Feb. 25; Port Huron, March 1 and 2 and April 21.

Port Huron may have a boot and shoe factory in the near future, which will give employment to a large number of men and women.

1,100 bushels of clover seed was threshed by John Campbell, of Kimball the past season, and \$700 the amount he received for same.

Miss Belle Gibb and Mr. Fred Schneider both of Port Huron were married Tuesday afternoon, and left for California the same evening.

The erection of a monument to commemorate the services of the soldiers and sailors of St. Clair county is being talked of by Wm. Sanborn Post, G. A. R.

Capac Journal says it is rumored that Dit Walker will resign from the custom service next spring, and engage in the manufacture of brick at that place.

Robert Murray has been committed for manslaughter and released on \$3,000 bail. The case will likely be tried at the February term of the circuit court, which begins on the 20th.

And now the Port Huron people are talking the Marine City people into bringing their prospective railroad to Port Huron instead of to Detroit, and possibly this will be done.

A consolidation has taken place between the First Congl church and Society of Port Huron. They have hitherto been separate bodies, transacting business separately and distinct from each other.

Asa Hulbert, of Smith's, aged 84 years, died on the 5th of Feb. His was the first death ever occurring in his house, which has been built about 50 years. His wife and six children survive him.

The special election held at Marine City the 6th to decide whether the city should be bonded for \$8,000 to extend the water works system to the Third ward, resulted in victory for the incorporationists.

Congressman Whiting, in a letter to the Sunday Herald, expresses his willingness to become one of ten or twenty who will furnish such co-operation as Church & Co. deem advisable to insure the removal of their Saleratus works to Port Huron.
