COLD MID-MARCH WEATHER.

Its Effect on Farming Operations in All Parts of the Country. General Greely has just issued the following special weather bulletin for the week ending March 15.

The week has been colder than usual in the central valleys, the Gulf States, in Oregon, Northern California, and over the Southern and Central plateau regions, the deficiency in temperature in these sections ranging from 5° to 10° below the normal daily temperature for the week.

The season from January 1 to March 15 has been unusually warm generally over that portion of the country east of the Mississippi, and from Missouri, Kansas and Colorado southward to the Gulf Coast and the Rio Grande Valley.

During the week there has been more rain than usual in the central valleys, the region of excessive rains extending from Eastern Texas northward to Eastern Iowa and northeastward over Mississippi, East Tennessee and the States of the Ohio Valley.

Freezing weather continues in the Northwest, where the season is backward and the ground frozen, and although the rainfall has been less than usual in this section, ample moisture is reported.

What is reported in good condition in Texas, but the planting of corn and cotton has been delayed by cool weather and rain, and in some sections irrigation will be necessary.
